The General Assembly 20 21 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 22 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 23 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in 24 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the 25 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary 26 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the 27 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 28 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. 29 30 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 31 32 void. 33 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as

34 established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be
35 requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request.

CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not 15 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and 16 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas 17 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-18 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas 19 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services 20 offered through CHFLI. 11 SECTION 39. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 12 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 13 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 14 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 15 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 16 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 17 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 18 19

20 SECTION 40. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 21 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 22 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 25 26 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 27 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 28 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 29 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 30 31 32 *(s)* Joint Budget Committee 33 34
