- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2005}{2007}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2007}{2009}$ .

Of the funds appropriated in the appropriations-operations section of this

Act, \$250,000 each year of the biennium may be allocated as the State's
