1 2 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 4 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES. Upon determination by the president or chancellor of Arkansas State University an institution of higher education that a 5 6 reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or consolidation of 7 administrative functions within the university institution is necessary for 8 efficient and effective operations of the university institution, the 9 president or chancellor, with approval of the Arkansas State University Board 10 of Trustees institution's board of trustees, may have the authority to 11 transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between campuses, 12 divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of Arkansas State University 13 the institution, after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities 14 15 shall be used for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved 16 by the General Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations 17 which involve academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher 18 Education and receive prior approval from the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee prior to submission to the Legislative Council or 19 20 Joint Budget Committee. Provided, however, that the institution shall be 21 limited to submitting no more than four (4) individual transaction transfer 22 requests during any fiscal year and shall be further limited to no more than 23 five percent (5%) of the total General Revenue and Special Revenue 24 appropriation, funding, positions specific to each institution and no Tobacco Settlement funds or appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this 25 26 section. 27 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 28 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency institutions of 29 higher education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. 30 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency institutions of higher education and 31 32 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 33 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 34 has determined that Arkansas State University institutions of higher 35 education may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to 36 Arkansas State University institutions of higher education authorizing broad

1 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 2 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 3 4 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 5 6 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 7 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 8 void.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LEASES. 13 14 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Board of Trustees of Arkansas 15 State University may hereafter lease facilities for operations for room and 16 board purposes for students only in any manner and upon terms the board deems 17 to be in the best interest of the university. Action taken under this act shall be by written resolution adopted by at least a majority of the members 18 19 of the board.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
21 <u>2007</u> through June 30, 2007 <u>2009</u>.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 25 CONTINGENCY. (a) To address needs emerging from the restructuring of the 26 Technical Institutes, ASU Technical Center shall establish and maintain for 27 the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennium a pool of four (4) unclassified positions 28 and three (3) classified positions, payable from funds appropriated for ASU 29 Technical Center. These positions are to be used by ASU Technical Center in 30 the event that the number and level of positions available to address the 31 needs emerging from business and industry driven program expansions exceeds 32 the number of positions regularly authorized for ASU Technical Center. 33 (b) ASU Technical Center shall provide justification to the Department of 34 Finance and Administration's Office of Personnel Management (OPM) for the need to allocate titles from this position pool. No classifications will be 35 36 assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested and

1 justified by ASU Technical Center, recommended by OPM and approved by the 2 Legislative Council. ASU Technical Center may transfer positions from this pool to any pay schedule the agency currently maintains or any pay schedule 3 4 the agency receives during the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennium. 5 (c) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is 6 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 7 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the 8 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has 9 determined that ASU Technical Center could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that agency. That flexibility is being 10 11 accomplished by providing growth pools in subsection (a) of this section and 12 since the General Assembly has granted the agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 13 14 Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the growth pool by 15 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the 16 growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative 17 Council is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional by a court of 18 19 competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009.

26 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 28 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged 29 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the 30 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December 31 32 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or 33 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during 34 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due. 35 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon 36

1 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 2 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 3 4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 5 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 6 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 7 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 8 with in disbursement of said funds.

10 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 22 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 30 31 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 32 33 34 35 36
