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Subtitle

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - VARIOUS DIVISIONS AND THE ARKANSAS
ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY. There is hereby established for the University of
Arkansas - Various Divisions and the Archeological Survey for the 2007-2009
biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries
shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and
all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the
provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas

31 authority granted elsewhere in Arkansas statutes for the payment of
32 allowances or bonuses to coaches at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
34 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

36 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
2 APPRENTICE PROGRAM WAGES. All apprentices in the University of Arkansas U.S.
3 Department of Labor Approved Apprentices Program shall be appointed into the
4 State of Arkansas Classified Pay Plan title of Grade 11 Apprentice Tradesman
5 at the then Labor Market Entry Rate.

6 Using successive Arkansas Department of Labor Prevailing Wage
7 Determination (ADLPWD) Building Rates for Washington County for the craft
8 title matching that Apprentice's craft training, individual Apprentices shall
9 be paid progressively increasing wages upon successful completion of
10 successive years of training for their craft. Progressively increasing, as
11 strongly encouraged for this type program by the U.S. Department of Labor, is
12 defined as a percentage difference between the Apprentice's current salary
13 and the next year's ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate
14 for their chosen craft, but not less than the preceding year's wages with any
15 authorized cost of living (COLA) applied.

16 Upon successful completion of the Apprentices Program, fulfillment of all
17 related licensing requirements, and availability of an open Skilled Trades
18 Worker position (if not already in a Grade 17 Skilled Trades Worker
19 position), all Apprentices Program graduates shall be promoted to a Grade 17
20 Skilled Trades Worker position and earn the ADLPWD Washington County Building
21 Rates Basic Hourly Rate for the classification of their chosen craft except
22 that: "No Apprentices Program graduate shall earn wages less than Grade 17
23 Skilled Trades Worker Level I."

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005

27 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER
29 SCHOOL EMPLOYEES. Employees of School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts
30 who, in addition to working during the regular school term also work during
31 the summer months, shall be authorized as additional compensation an amount
32 not to exceed ~~1/12~~ 1/10 of their annual salary for each month or part thereof
33 worked. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as exceeding the
34 maximum salary authorized for said employees. Payment of additional
35 compensation shall be limited to employees ~~in the following classifications~~

11 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER
13 GRANT RELATED FUNDING PROVISION. Teachers of the School for Mathematics and
14 Sciences and the Arts who, in addition to fulfilling annual teaching contract
15 requirements also write grants, grant progress reports and write and publish
16 papers may be authorized as additional annual compensation an amount up to
17 ~~1/12~~ 1/10 of their annual salary. Such additional compensation shall not be
18 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. The
19 additional compensation authorized by this section shall only be paid from a
20 portion of the grant monies received and shall not be paid from state general
21 revenues or Educational Excellence Trust Fund monies.

25 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated 6-64-1013,

30 obligations, personnel, and authority to levy and collect diagnostic and

33 hereby transferred by a Type 2 transfer from the Arkansas Livestock and

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1 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
3 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
4 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
5 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
6 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
7 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
8 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during

10 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the

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18 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
19 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
20 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
21 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
22 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
23 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
24 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
25 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
26 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

29 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
30 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

33 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
34 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral

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2 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
3 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
4 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
5 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
6 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
7 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
8 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
9 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
10 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
11 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
12 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
