SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 12 13 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 14 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 15 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 16 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 17 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 18 19 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 20 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 21 with in disbursement of said funds.

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23 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 24 25 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 26 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 27 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 28 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 29 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 30 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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32 <u>SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the General 33 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of 34 the University of Arkansas are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient 35 for the University of Arkansas to continue to provide essential governmental 36 services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies

1	for the University of Arkansas to continue such services; and that a delay in
2	the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper
3	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
4	an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
5	immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
6	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
7	If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
8	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
9	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
10	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
11	the veto.
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
