26	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code § 17-84-101 is amende	ed to read as follows:
27	17-84-101. Definitio	ns.	
28	As used in this chapt	er <del>, unless the context ot</del>	herwise requires:
29	(1) "Board" me	ans the Arkansas Board of	Hearing Instrument
30	Dispensers;

- 2 (4) "Hearing instrument" means any instrument or device worn in
- 3 or behind the ear designed for or represented as aiding, improving,
- 4 amplifying, or correcting human hearing and any parts, attachments, or
- 5 accessories of such an instrument or device;
- 6 (5) "In-office assembled hearing instrument" means an instrument
- 7 built by the hearing instrument dispenser or under his or her supervision
- 8 from components, including a premanufactured faceplate and a shell made by
- 9 the dispenser or made under his or her supervision;
- 10 (6) "License" and "internship" mean, respectively, license as
- 11 provided for in § 17-84-306 and internship as provided for in § 17-84-304;
- 12 (7) "Licensed" means holding a current license;
- 13 (8) "Practice of dispensing hearing instruments" means
- 14 conducting and interpreting hearing tests for purposes of identifying the
- 15 type and degree of hearing loss and making proper recommendations based on
- 16 those results, selecting suitable hearing instruments, making earmolds or ear
- 17 impressions, and providing appropriate counseling pertaining to the selling,
- 18 renting, leasing, pricing, delivery, and warranty of hearing instruments;
- 19 (9) "Sponsor" means a licensed person who trains and directly
- 20 supervises an intern; and
- 21 (10) "Unethical conduct" includes, but is not limited to:
- 22 (A) Obtaining any fee or making any sale by fraud or
- 23 misrepresentation;
- 24 (B) Employing directly or indirectly any unlicensed person
- 25 to perform any work covered by this chapter;
- 26 (C) Using or causing or promoting the use of any
- 27 advertising matter, promotional literature, testimonial, guarantee, warranty,
- 28 label, brand, insignia, or any other representation, however made, which is
- 29 misleading or untruthful;
- 30 (D) Advertising a particular model, type, or kind of
- 31 hearing instrument for sale when prospective purchasers responding to the
- 32 advertisement cannot purchase or are dissuaded from purchasing the advertised
- 33 model, type, or kind if the purpose of the advertisement is to obtain
- 34 prospects for the sale of a model, type, or kind other than that advertised;
- 35 (E) Falsely representing that the services or advice of a
- 36 person licensed to practice medicine will be used or made available in the

- 1 selection, fitting, adjustment, maintenance, or repair of hearing instruments
- 2 or using the words "doctor", "audiologist", or "clinic", or like words,
- 3 abbreviations, or symbols which suggest the medical profession when such use
- 4 is not accurate;
- 5 (F) Permitting another to use the holder's license or
- 6 internship certificate;
- 7 (G) In any manner making false representations concerning
- 8 a competitor or his or her products, business methods, selling prices,
- 9 values, credit terms, policies, services, reliability, ability to perform
- 10 contracts, credit standing, integrity, or morals;
- 11 (H) In any manner using, imitating, or simulating the
- 12 trademark, trade name, corporate name, brand, model name, or number or label
- 13 of any competitor, manufacturer, or product when it implies or represents a
- 14 relationship that does not exist;
- 15 (I) Obtaining information concerning the business of a
- 16 competitor by bribery of any employee or agent of the competitor, by the
- 17 impersonation of one in authority, or by any other unfair or deceptive means;
- 18 and
- 19 (J) Directly or indirectly giving or offering to give
- 20 anything of value to any person who advises others in a professional capacity
- 21 as an inducement to influence others to purchase products sold by a hearing
- 22 instrument dispenser or to refrain from dealing with a competitor.

- 24 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-84-201 is amended to read as follows:
- 25 17-84-201. Creation and composition.
- 26 (a) There is created the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument
- 27 Dispensers.
- 28 (b) The board shall be composed of eight (8) members appointed by the
- 29 Governor for terms of three (3) years as follows:
- 30 (1)(A) At least four (4) of the members shall be hearing
- 31 instrument dispensers licensed under this chapter who have held a valid
- 32 license for at least three (3) years.
- 33 (B) The Governor shall consider nominations from the
- 34 Arkansas Hearing Society and the Arkansas Speech-Language-Hearing
- 35 Association:
- 36 (2) At least one (1) member shall be a physician licensed to

- 1 practice medicine in Arkansas and specializing in otology or otolaryngology;
- 2 (3) At least one (1) member shall be an audiologist holding a
- 3 master's degree or doctoral degree in audiology from a recognized college or
- 4 university; and
- 5 (4) Two (2) members shall not be actively engaged in or retired
- 6 from the practice of dispensing hearing instruments. One (1) member shall
- 7 represent consumers, and one (1) member shall be sixty (60) years of age or
- 8 older. Both members shall be appointed from the state at large subject to
- 9 confirmation by the Senate and shall be full voting members but shall not
- 10 participate in the grading of examinations.
- 11 (c)(1) All terms shall expire on July 31 of the designated year.
- 12 (2) Each member shall serve for the term of his or her
- 13 appointment and until his or her successor has been appointed and qualified.
- 14 (3) No member shall serve more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  three (3) terms
- 15 consecutively.
- 16 (d) In the event of a vacancy on the board, a new member shall be 17 appointed to serve out the unexpired term.
- 18 (e) The Governor may remove any member for cause.
- 19 (f) Any board member who was appointed to a seven-year term or to fill
- 20 a vacancy for the remainder of a seven-year term shall not have his or her
- 21 term reduced to a three-year term as provided for in subsection (b) of this
- 22 section.

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- 24 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-84-203 is amended to read as follows:
- 25 17-84-203. Powers and duties.
- The powers and duties of the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument
- 27 Dispensers are:
- 28 (1) To authorize all disbursements necessary to carry out the
- 29 provisions of this chapter and to receive and account for all fees;
- 30 (2) To furnish a list of study materials for applicants to use
- 31 in preparing for qualifying examinations;
- 32 (3) To prepare, supervise, and administer at least once each
- 33 year a qualifying examination based on nationally accepted norms to test the
- 34 knowledge and proficiency of applicants;
- 35 (4) To register, issue, and renew licenses and internships to
- 36 persons qualified under this chapter and to suspend, revoke, or refuse to

1 renew licenses and internships pursuant to this chapter; 2 (5) To make rules and regulations not inconsistent with the laws 3 of this state which are necessary for the enforcement and orderly 4 administration of this chapter. However, no rule or regulation shall be 5 promulgated which in any manner serves to restrict the number of licenses 6 which may be issued in any city, town, or county of this state; 7 (6) To require the periodic inspection and calibration of 8 audiometric testing equipment and tympanometers and to carry out the periodic 9 inspection of facilities of persons who practice the fitting or selling of 10 hearing instruments; 11 (7) To employ and retain the services of attorneys, accountants, 12 and other necessary assistants in carrying out the provisions of this 13 chapter; 14 (8) To require, if the board deems necessary, an applicant, 15 dealer, or licensee to furnish a surety bond in an amount fixed by the board 16 for the benefit of any person damaged as the result of a violation of this 17 chapter. All requirements pertaining to the surety bond may be promulgated by regulation of the board; 18 19 (9) To set the following fees: (A) An application fee not to exceed one hundred fifty 20 21 dollars (\$150) two hundred fifty dollars (\$250); 22 (B) An examination fee not to exceed: one hundred fifty 23 dollars (\$150) 24 (i) One hundred fifty dollars (\$150) for the written 25 examination; and 26 (ii) Fifty dollars (\$50.00) each for the earmold 27 practicum, the audiometric practicum, and the law and rules practicum; 28 (C) A reexamination fee not to exceed one hundred fifty 29 dollars (\$150) the fee under subdivision (9)(B) of this section for the 30 portion of the examination being retaken; 31 (D) A permanent registration fee not to exceed fifty 32 dollars (\$50.00) seventy-five dollars (\$75.00); 33 (E) An annual license fee not to exceed two hundred 34 dollars (\$200) two hundred fifty dollars (\$250);

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T	(G) A license reinstatement lee of one and one-half (1.3)

4	(H) An internship fee not to exceed one hundred fifty
5	dollars (\$150) two hundred fifty dollars (\$250);
6	(I) A fee for an endorsement to another state not to
7	exceed twenty dollars (\$20.00);
8	(J) A license replacement fee or a duplicate license fee
9	not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00);
10	(K) An insufficient funds fee not to exceed twenty-five
11	dollars (\$25.00); and
12	(L) A continuing education unit approval fee not to exceed
13	two hundred fifty dollars (\$250);
14	(10) To employ investigators, issue subpoenas, and perform all
15	activities necessary to effectively investigate claims and pursue
16	disciplinary action against licensees; and
17	(11) To establish the standards of practice for hearing
18	instrument dispensers in the State of Arkansas.
19	
20	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-84-304 is amended to read as follows:
21	17-84-304. Internship and applications - Qualifications of applicants
22	Qualifications for licensure and internship.
23	(a)(1) Prior to applying for a license, each applicant other than
24	those meeting the requirements of subdivisions (e)(2), (e)(3), (e)(4), or
25	(e)(5) of this section must complete a one-year employment internship during
26	which he or she is under the direct personal and physical supervision of a
27	sponsor who has continuously held in good standing for a period of not less
28	than three (3) years either a valid Arkansas hearing instrument dispenser's
29	license or a valid Arkansas audiology license.
30	(2) An internship will be valid only if prior to beginning the
31	internship period the applicant:
32	(A) Makes application for internship approval on forms
33	supplied by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers;
34	(B) Pays the internship fees prescribed by the board
35	<del>pursuant to this chapter; and</del>
36	(C) Shows to the satisfaction of the board that during the

-	period of the incommit he of the will be under the direct personal and
2	physical supervision of a sponsor who has continuously held a valid Arkansas
3	hearing instrument dispenser's or Arkansas audiologist's license for a period
4	of not less than three (3) years.
5	(3) A person participating in a valid internship program may
6	take the licensing examination administered by the board upon written
7	recommendation of his or her sponsor after successfully completing six (6)
8	months in the internship program. If the person satisfactorily passes the
9	examination, he or she may complete the one-year internship program under the
10	oversight of the sponsor without personal and physical supervision.
11	(b) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person during the
12	course of his or her internship to practice the dispensing of hearing
13	instruments except under the direct personal and physical supervision of a
14	person who has continuously held a valid Arkansas hearing instrument
15	dispenser's or Arkansas audiologist's license for a period of not less than
16	three (3) years.
17	(c) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any sponsor of an
18	intern to knowingly allow or require that intern to practice the dispensing
19	of hearing instruments except under the sponsor's direct personal and
20	physical supervision.
21	(d) An applicant for a license under this chapter shall:
22	(1) Submit a written application and request for examination in
23	the form and within the time prescribed by the board;
24	(2) Pay an application and examination fee as prescribed by the
25	board, pursuant to this chapter; and
26	(3) Show to the satisfaction of the board that the applicant:
27	(Λ) Is twenty (20) years of age or older;
28	(B) Has an education equivalent to two (2) years of
29	accredited college-level course work from a regionally accredited college or
30	university;
31	(C) Is of good moral character; and
32	(D) Has satisfactorily passed the examination in the form
33	and within the time prescribed by the board.
34	(e) Prior to applying for a license under this chapter, an applicant
35	must:
36	(1) Complete a one-year internship as provided for in this

1	section;
2	(2) Hold National Board of Certified Hearing Instrument Sciences
3	certification;
4	(3) Be registered as a hearing instrument dispenser in good
5	standing in another state whose licensing requirements meet or exceed the
6	licensing requirements of the State of Arkansas at the time of his or her
7	application;
8	(4) Be a graduate of an American Conference of Audioprosthology
9	program; or
10	(5) Hold an Associate of Applied Science degree in Hearing
11	Healthcare Practitioner or a similar degree from a regionally accredited
12	college or university.
13	(a) An applicant for a license or an internship shall:
14	(1) Submit an application on the form and within the time
15	prescribed by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers;
16	(2) Pay an application fee in the amount prescribed by the
17	board; and
18	(3) Show to the satisfaction of the board that he or she:
19	(A) Is twenty (20) years of age or older;
20	(B) Has an education equivalent of two (2) or more years
21	of accredited college-level course work from a regionally accredited college
22	or university; and
23	(C) Is of good moral character.
24	(b) An applicant who meets the qualifications set out in subsection
25	(a) of this section shall meet at least one (1) of the following criteria:
26	(1) Complete a one-year employment internship during which he or
27	she is under the direct personal and physical supervision of a sponsor who
28	has continuously held in good standing for a period of not less than three
29	(3) years either a valid Arkansas hearing instrument dispenser's license or a
30	valid Arkansas audiology license;
31	(2) Hold a National Board of Certified Hearing Instrument
32	Sciences Certificate;
33	(3) Be registered as a hearing instrument dispenser in good
34	standing in another state whose licensing requirements meet or exceed the
35	licensing requirements of the State of Arkansas at the time of his or her
36	application;

1	(4) be a graduate of an American Conference of Audioprosthology
2	program; or
3	(5) Hold an Associate of Applied Science degree in Hearing
4	Healthcare Practitioner or a similar degree from a regionally accredited
5	college or university.
6	(c) Before the beginning of the internship period, the applicant
7	shall:
8	(1) Receive board approval of the application and training
9	schedule; and
10	(2) Pay the internship fee prescribed by the board under this
11	chapter.
12	(d)(l) A person participating in a valid internship program may take
13	the licensing examination administered by the board upon written
14	recommendation of his or her sponsor after successfully completing six (6)
15	months in the internship program.
16	(2) If the person successfully passes the examination, he or she
17	may complete the one-year internship program under the oversight of the
18	sponsor without personal and physical supervision if he or she works out of
19	the same place of business as the sponsor.
20	(3) If the person fails the examination, he or she shall
21	complete the full one-year internship before reexamination.
22	(4) Any examination taken during an internship shall be
23	considered as one (1) of three (3) attempts to pass the examination allowed
24	under § 17-84-305(d).
25	(5) It is a violation of this chapter for any person during the
26	course of his or her internship to practice the dispensing of hearing
27	instruments except under:
28	(A) The direct personal and physical supervision of his or
29	her sponsor; or
30	(B) The conditions set out in this subdivision (d).
31	
32	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-84-305(b), concerning the contents for
33	examinations given by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers, is
34	amended to read as follows:
35	(b) The examination may be written or practical, or both, and shall
36	consist of: (1) Tests tests of knowledge in the following areas as they

1	pertain to the fitting of hearing instruments:	
2	(A)(1) Basic physics of sound;	
3	(B)(2) The human hearing mechanism, including the science of	
4	hearing and the causes and rehabilitation of abnormal hearing and hearing	
5	disorders;	
6	(C)(3) Structure and function of hearing instruments;	
7	(D)(4) Pure tone audiometry, including air conduction testing	
8	and bone conduction testing;	
9	(E)(5) Live voice or recorded voice speech audiometry, including	
10	speech reception threshold testing and speech discrimination testing;	
11	(F)(6) Effective masking;	
12	(G)(7) Recording and evaluation of audiograms and speech	
13	audiometry to determine hearing instrument candidacy;	
14	(H)(8) Selection and adaptation of hearing instruments; and	
15	(1)(9) Taking earmold impressions; and	
16	(10) Tympanometry; and	
17	$\frac{(2)}{(11)}$ Testing of other knowledge and skills as may be required	
18	to determine an applicant's ability and suitability for the practice of	
19	dispensing hearing instruments to the public.	
20		
21	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 17-84-305(d), concerning persons who pass	
22	the examination given by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers,	
23	is amended to read as follows:	
24	(d) $\underline{(1)}$ Applicants who fail to pass the required examination may retake	
25	the examination by paying a reexamination fee, as prescribed by the board	
26	pursuant to this chapter, for each additional examination taken.	
27	(2) After three (3) failed attempts to pass the examination, the	
28	applicant must shall complete an internship or repeat the internship	
29	described in § 17-84-304.	
30		
31	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 17-84-306(d)(2), concerning issuance and	
32	renewal of licenses, is amended to read as follows:	
33	(2) The board shall require that all applicants seeking renewal	
34	of their licenses shall present written evidence of annual calibration of all	
35	audiometers and tympanometers to current national standards.	
36
