33	ALLOCATION REGULATIONS. The Arkansas Department of Higher E	duca	tion shall
34	adopt rules and regulations for the allocation of the funds	appr	opriated by
35	this Act to ensure that the funds are allocated and expended	in	a manner
36	consistent with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code	app1	icable to the

- 1 Arkansas Higher Education General Obligation Bond Program (Program). The
- 2 <u>funds appropriated and allocated pursuant to this Act shall be allocated and</u>
- 3 expended pursuant to Act 1282 of 2005, as amended, this Act and the rules and
- 4 regulations promulgated hereunder, and shall be exempt from any other
- 5 provisions of state law which conflicts with any provision of the rules and
- 6 regulations which are required to ensure the compliance of the Program with
- 7 the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
- 9 through June 30, 2009.

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- 11 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SYSTEMS
- 13 TECHNOLOGY. Any distribution of proceeds made by the Arkansas Department of
- 14 Higher Education to applicable institutions of Higher Education for E-
- 15 Corridor projects shall be made only following review and subsequent approval
- 16 of E-Corridor projects costs by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
- 17 Board in accordance with the provisions of Arkansas Code Annotated 6-62-1115.
- 18 Large integrated software information systems such as student information
- 19 systems, financial records systems, pharmacy records systems, doctor's orders
- 20 systems or software costs associated with the E-Corridors projects shall be
- 21 <u>eligible expenditures</u>.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
- 23 through June 30, 2009.

- 25 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. <u>FUND CREATED</u>. There is hereby established on
- 26 the books of the State Treasurer, State Auditor, and Chief Fiscal Officer of
- 27 the State a fund to be known as the "Higher Education Technology and Facility
- 28 Trust Fund". Such fund shall consist of proceeds from the sale of bonds as
- 29 issued by the Arkansas Development Finance Authority for any project financed
- 30 under the "Arkansas Higher Education Technology and Facility Improvement Act
- 31 of 2005", in amounts or portions as set forth in the resolution or trust
- 32 indenture authorizing or securing such bonds, there to be used to provide for
- 33 the development of projects at state institutions of higher education and the
- 34 payment of project costs duly approved by the Arkansas Higher Education
- 35 Coordinating Board as set forth in the "Arkansas Higher Education Technology
- 36 and Facility Improvement Act of 2005".

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007 2 through June 30, 2009. 3 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. METHOD OF 5 6 FINANCING - FUNDING. The bond proceeds amounts requisitioned and certified by 7 the Chair of the Higher Education Coordinating Board and approved by the 8 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to be disbursed for each project of an 9 institution, as required by Arkansas Code Annotated 6-62-1115, or an accurate 10 estimate from the Chair of the Higher Education Coordinating Board and 11 approved by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and certified for each project of an institution, shall be considered a valid method of financing 12 amount in meeting the requirements of Arkansas Code Annotated 22-9-104 and 13 the regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in submitting 14 15 capital expenditure requests. 16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007 17 through June 30, 2009. 18 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 19 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 20 21 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 22 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 23 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 24 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 25 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 26 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 27 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 28 29 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 30 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 31 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 32 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 33 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 34 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 35 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 36 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

2	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
3	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
4	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
5	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
6	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
7	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
8	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
9	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
10	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
11	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
12	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
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
