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- 20 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 22 Fees Disposition.
- 23 (a) The State Board of Collection Agencies may charge an annual license 24 fee not to exceed one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) for licensing each 25 collection agency and an annual fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for licensing 26 each employee of the licensed collection agency who as an employee solicits, 27 collects, or attempts to collect any delinquent account or accounts by 28 telephone, mail, personal contact, or otherwise.
- 29 (b) All income from fees imposed under this section shall be distributed 30 as follows:
- 31 (1) Beginning July 1, 2005 the first one hundred and fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000) shall be remitted in one payment by the board to the 33 Treasurer of State for the Department of <u>Health and Human Services</u> Division of Medical Services and deposited into a paying account as determined by the 35 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to be used in accordance with Arkansas Code 20-10-705.

- 1 (2) All funds remaining after the distribution in subdivision (b)(1)
 2 of this section received during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, shall
 3 be remitted by the board to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
 4 for deposit in a financial institution in accordance with the policies of the
 5 University of Arkansas. The funds shall be expended for the College of
 6 Pharmacy and the College of Nursing in accordance with § 6-64-417; and
- 7 (3)(A) Beginning July 1, 2006 and each July 1 thereafter, the first
 8 one hundred and fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000) in fees received by the
 9 board shall be remitted in one payment by the board to the Treasurer of State
 10 for the Department of <u>Health and Human Services</u> Division of Medical
 11 Services and deposited into a paying account as determined by the Chief
 12 Fiscal Officer of the State to be used in accordance with Arkansas Code 20-
 - (B) The funds remaining after the distribution in subdivision (3)(A) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007 and funds each July 1 thereafter received by the board in an amount not to exceed six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) each fiscal year shall be remitted by the board to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for deposit into a financial institution in accordance with the policies of the University of Arkansas. The funds shall be expended for the College of Pharmacy and the College of Nursing in accordance with § 6-64-417.
 - (C) Funds remaining after the distributions in subdivisions (b)(3)(A) and (b)(3)(B) of this section shall be deposited to the State Board of Collection Agencies account in some bank authorized to do business in this state.

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- SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 College of Nursing and College of Pharmacy program improvements.
- 30 (a) Funds received from the State Board of Collection Agencies under 31 § 17-24-305 by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and any 32 interest earnings on the funds by the University of Arkansas for Medical 33 Sciences shall be used exclusively as follows:
- 34 (1) Two-thirds (2/3) of the funds shall be used within the College of 35 Nursing for:
 - (A) Scholarships and stipends for nursing students who are

- l candidates for bachelor's or master's degrees or degrees beyond a master's
- 2 degree; and

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- 3 (B) Salary improvements for purposes of retaining and attracting 4 nursing school faculty; and
- 5 (2) One-third (1/3) of the funds shall be used within the College of 6 Pharmacy for:
 - (A) Scholarships and stipends for pharmacy students;
- 8 (B) Facility improvements required to expand the enrollment of 9 pharmacy students; and
- 10 (C) Salary improvements for purposes of retaining and attracting 11 pharmacy school faculty.
- 12 (b)(1) The Dean of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
 13 College of Nursing shall allocate the funds made available to the College of
 14 Nursing under this section.
- 15 (2) The Graduate Nurse Educator Loan and Scholarship Board shall make 16 recommendations to the dean regarding the recipients of annual awards, 17 stipends, and scholarships.
- 18 (3) A recipient of a scholarship or stipend under this subsection (b)
 19 must be a resident of the State of Arkansas.
- 20 (c)(1) The Dean of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
 21 College of Pharmacy shall allocate the funds made available to the College of
 22 Pharmacy under this section.
- 23 (2) Using financial aid and academic performance data, the University
 24 of Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Pharmacy Awards and Financial Aid
 25 Committee will make recommendations to the faculty regarding the recipients
 26 of annual awards, stipends, and scholarships.
 - (3) A recipient of a stipend or scholarship under this subsection (c):
 - (A) Must be a resident of the State of Arkansas;
 - (B) Is not required to repay a stipend or scholarship; and
- 30 (C) Is not required to enter into any agreement with the university 31 or College of Pharmacy requiring the recipient to practice pharmacy in any 32 area of Arkansas after graduation in exchange for a stipend or scholarship.
- 33 (d) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall report annually 34 the utilization of the funds received by the College of Nursing under this 35 section to the Legislative Council and the Arkansas Legislative Commission on 36 Nursing.

1 (e) Scholarships and other awards under this section may be granted in 2 addition to other funds awarded to a student under other scholarship and 3 assistance programs. 4 SECTION 9. EMPLOYMENT OF ATTORNEYS. None of the funds appropriated in 5 6 this Act for Maintenance and General Operation shall be expended in payment 7 for services of attorneys, unless the agency shall first make a request in 8 writing to the Attorney General of the State of Arkansas to provide the 9 required legal services. The Attorney General's Office shall provide the requested legal services, or, if the Attorney General's Office shall 10 11 determine that sufficient personnel are not available to provide the 12 requested legal services, the Attorney General shall certify the same to the agency and may authorize the agency to employ legal counsel and to expend 13 14 monies appropriated for Maintenance and General Operations therefor, if: 15 The Attorney General determines, and certifies in writing, that such 16 agency needs the advice or assistance of legal counsel, and 17 The Attorney General consents in writing to the employment of the 18 legal counsel to be retained by the agency. 19 Such certification shall be required with respect to each instance of the employment of special legal counsel, or shall be required annually with 20 21 respect to legal counsel employed on a retainer basis. A copy of such 22 certification shall be entered in the official minutes of the agency, and 23 shall be retained in the fiscal records of the agency for audit purposes. 24 25 SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 26 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 27 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 28 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 29 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 30 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 31 32 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be

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SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

1	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
2	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
3	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
4	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
5	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
6	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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8	SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
9	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
10	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
11	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
12	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
13	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
14	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
15	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
16	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
17	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
18	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
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
