9	SECTION 18. Arkansas Code § 6-21-811(a), concerning the Academic
10	Facilities Distress Program. is amended to read as follows:
11	(a) The Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
12	Transportation shall identify a public school or school district as being in
13	academic facilities distress if the division determines that the public
14	school or school district has engaged in actions or inactions that result in
15	any of the following:
16	(1) Any act or violation determined by the division to
17	jeopardize any academic facility used by a public school or school district,
18	including, but not limited to:
19	(A) Material failure to properly maintain academic
20	facilities in accordance with this subchapter and rules adopted by the
21	Commission for Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation;
22	(B) Material violation of local, state, or federal fire,
23	health, or safety code provisions or laws;
24	(C) Material violation of applicable building code
25	provisions or law;
26	(D) Material failure to provide timely and accurate

29	purchasing or bid requirements in relation to academic facilities projects;

31	(F) Material default on any school district debt
32	obligation; or
33	(G) Material failure to plan and progress satisfactorily
34	toward accomplishing the priorities established by the division and the
35	approved school district master plans; or
36	(2) Any other condition of an academic facility or facilities in

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a public school or school district that is determined by the division to have
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     a detrimental impact on educational services provided by that public school
     or school district.
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
