21	school-sponsored activities	
22	(1) A motor vehicle designed to carry more than ten (10)	
23	passengers owned by a public or governmental agency and operated for the

26	(2) A motor vehicle designed to carry more than ten (10)	
27	passengers privately owned and operated for compensation for the

29	(b)(1) Any new school bus whose function involves the loading or	
30	discharging of <del>school children</del> <u>students</u> as passengers shall be equipped with	
31	a flashing white strobe light in order to provide greater visibility to	
32	drivers in approaching vehicles.	
33	(2) The strobe light shall be in addition to those flasher	
34	lights required under § 27-51-1002.	
35	(c) Any new school bus whose function involves the loading or	
36	discharging of <del>school children</del> <u>students</u> as passengers on a regular route	

- 1 shall be equipped with an electric, air, or hydraulic-operated crossing gate
- 2 in order to prevent school children a student from crossing in front of the
- 3 bus in such a way that the school bus driver is unlikely to see them.
- 4 (d) On and after July 1, 1997, all other school buses shall be
- 5 retrofitted with a flashing white strobe light and an electric, air, or
- 6 hydraulic-operated crossing gate for purposes as described in this section.
- 7 (e)  $\frac{By}{NO}$  later than July 1 of each year, the superintendent of
- 8 each local school district shall certify to the Division of Public School
- 9 Academic Facilities and Transportation that the district is in compliance

- 20 distance of at least two hundred feet (200') from the vehicle
- 21 (1) A motor vehicle designed to carry more than ten (10)

- 23 transportation of students to or from school or school-sponsored activities;
