11 ARKANSAS GOVERNOR'S DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARSHIPS;

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15 *TO PROVIDE UP TO THREE HUNDRED (300)*
16 *ARKANSAS GOVERNOR'S DISTINGUISHED*
17 *SCHOLARSHIPS.*
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-82-308 is amended to read as follows:

24 6-82-308. Number and geographic distribution of scholarships.

25 (a) If sufficient funds are available, effective for students
26 receiving their initial awards beginning in fall ~~2005~~ 2007, the number of
27 initial scholarship awards to eligible high achievers shall not exceed ~~three~~
28 ~~hundred twenty five (325)~~ three hundred seventy-five (375) each year, to be
29 distributed as follows;

30 (1) Up to ~~two hundred fifty (250)~~ three hundred (300) Arkansas
31 Governor's Distinguished Scholarships; and

32 (2)(A) Seventy-five (75) Arkansas Governor's Scholarships at
33 four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per year.

34 (B) The seventy-five (75) Arkansas Governor's Scholarships
35 shall be awarded to one (1) student in each of the seventy-five (75) counties
36 in Arkansas.

10 ~~(2)(b)(1)~~ A report of the same that demonstrates based on economic
11 projections and revenue forecasts that sufficient funds are available to
12 award scholarships to high achievers relative to the number of Academic
13 Challenge Scholarship recipients shall be submitted to the House Interim
14 Committee on Education, ~~and~~ the Senate Interim Committee on Education, and
15 the Legislative Council for review prior to obligating the funds.

16 ~~(3)(2)~~ Should a shortfall of funds be projected, the department
17 Department of Higher Education shall promulgate regulations rules for the
18 priority funding of these scholarships and submit these proposed ~~regulations~~
19 rules to the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board for a public
20 hearing and to the ~~Legislative Council through its~~ Subcommittee on
21 Administrative Rules and Regulations Subcommittee of the Legislative Council
22 for review before implementing the regulations rules.

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24 SECTION 2. (a) The Department of Higher Education is authorized to
25 award scholarships to students who are accepted to a Washington, D.C. public
26 policy academic internship, as determined by the Department of Higher
27 Education, if funding is appropriated and available.

28 (b) The Department of Higher Education may promulgate rules to
29 administer this section.

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31 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
32 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that new scholarships under the
33 Arkansas Governor's scholarship program need to be awarded to students
34 graduating in May of 2007; that the Department of Higher Education needs
35 sufficient time to solicit and receive scholarship applications; and that
36 this act is immediately necessary to ensure the proper administration of the

1 scholarship program. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
2 act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
3 safety shall become effective on:

4 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

5 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
6 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
7 bill; or

8 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
9 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
