1 (e)(d) Any dependent of a disabled veteran, a prisoner of war, or a 2 person declared to be missing in action or killed in action or a person killed on ordnance delivery as defined by the provisions of this section, 3 4 upon his or her being accepted for enrollment into any state-supported 5 institution of higher education or state-supported technical or vocational 6 school in the State of Arkansas, shall be allowed to obtain a bachelor's 7 degree or certificate of completion or, if he or she did not receive any 8 undergraduate education in the State of Arkansas, a graduate or professional 9 degree, for so long as he or she is eligible, with assistance for the uncovered expense of tuition, fees, or other charges not covered by 10 11 Dependents' Educational Assistance Program's compensation paid during the months included in each semester or free of tuition, fees, or other charges 12 13 if found non-eligible for DEA but still eligible for this scholarship program free of tuition, fee or other charge from such institution or school. 14 15  $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{(e)}}$  Once a person qualifies as a dependent under the terms and 16 provisions of this section, there shall be no situation such as the return of 17 the parent or the reported death of the parent that will remove the dependent from the provisions or benefits of this section. 18 19 (f) An eligible recipient shall receive a scholarship for one (1) academic year, renewable for up to three (3) additional academic years if the 20 21 recipient meets continuing eligibility criteria established by the Department 22 of Higher Education. 2.3 (g) Any person receiving this scholarship as of June 30, 2007 will be 24 grandfathered into the program under the law as stated prior to July 1, 2007. 25 (h) In compliance with the Arkansas Department of Higher Education's 26 scholarship stacking policy, no student's total financial aid package, which 27 can include multiple scholarships, can exceed the recognized cost of 28 attendance at a higher education institution. 29 30 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-82-602 is repealed. 31 Children of certain veterans having served between September 16, 1940, 32 and December 31, 1946. 33 (a) For purposes of this section, "disabled veteran" means a person 34 who has been awarded special monthly compensation by the federal Department 35 of Veterans Affairs for service-connected, one hundred percent (100%) total

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and permanent disability.

1	(b) Any child of a parent or parents who are disabled veterans, were	
2	killed in action, or otherwise died while serving in the military or naval	
3	forces of the United States between September 16, 1940, and December 31,	
4	1946, or who were honorably and medically discharged while serving in either	
5	branch of the service between those dates and having died before December 31,	
6	1946, if that child is not otherwise eligible for educational assistance from	
7	the federal government, may make application to the Director of the	
8	Department of Higher Education for funds necessary for tuition and	
9	matriculation fees, board and room, books, and supplies while attending any
