 - (j)(1) Any fire protection sprinkler system that was installed prior to September 1, 1985, and which does not meet the standards set forth in the rules and regulations adopted by the board may be serviced and repaired by a firm registered pursuant to this subchapter. However, an installer of such a system shall service, when requested by an owner of the system and for a reasonable fee, that system which it has installed, so long as the installer has a current certificate of registration and a licensed responsible managing employee pursuant to this subchapter must be serviced, maintained, inspected, and repaired in accordance with current rules of the board.
