- 17 (a) The State Teacher Assistance Resource Program shall be

14	A student entering his or her sophomore, junior, or senior year and

19	or above on a 4.0 scale at an approved institution;

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25	6-81-1506. Duration - Amount - Repayment.	
26	(a)(1) The State Teacher Assistance Resource Program shall be used to	
27	provide:	
28	(A) A forgivable loan in the amount of three thousand	
29	dollars (\$3,000) per year for a sophomore, junior, or senior actively	
30	pursuing a degree in teaching, admitted to a teacher education program, or	
31	enrolled in a Master of Arts in Teaching program who commits to teach in a	
32	public school located in a geographical area of the state designated as	
33	having a critical shortage of teachers or in a subject matter area designated

35	(B) A two-year forgivable loan if the recipient is in a

- (f) Loan recipients required to repay loans as provided in subsection
  (e) of this section who fail to meet their repayment obligations may have
  added to their total obligation any costs for collection of the debt and
  shall have their teaching license in Arkansas revoked by the State Board of
  Education.
- 8 (g)(1) All funds appropriated to or otherwise received by the State
  9 Teacher Assistance Resource Program for forgivable loans, all funds received
  10 as repayment of forgivable loans, and all interest earned on these funds
  11 shall be placed in a revolving fund.
- 12 (2) This revolving fund shall be used for forgivable loans 13 granted under the State Teacher Assistance Resource Program.
- (h)(1) The department, as administrator for the State Teacher
  Assistance Resource Program, may use up to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)
  annually from the fund balance for costs associated with administration of
  the State Teacher Assistance Resource Program.
- 18 (2) These funds are in addition to funds required for collection 19 costs related to loan repayments.

- 30 (a) There is established a commission to be known as the State Teacher 31 Assistance Resource Commission.
