- 2 made to the Secretary of the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related
- 3 Techniques in writing on forms furnished by the board.
- 4 (B) The application shall be signed by the applicant in
- 5 his or her own handwriting and acknowledged before an officer authorized to
- 6 administer oaths.
- 7 (3) Before any applicant shall be eligible for an examination,
- 8 the applicant shall furnish satisfactory proof to the board that he or she:
- 9 (A) Is of good moral character by filing with his or her
- 10 application the affidavits of at least two (2) reputable acupuncturists who
- ll attest to his or her character;
- 12 (B) Has successfully completed not fewer than sixty (60)
- 13 semester credit hours of college education, to include a minimum of thirty
- 14 (30) semester credit hours in the field of science; and
- 15 (C) Has completed a program in acupuncture and related
- 16 techniques and has received a certificate or diploma from an institute
- 17 approved by the board as described in this section. The training received in
- 18 the program shall be for a period of no fewer than four (4) academic years
- 19 and shall include a minimum of eight hundred (800) hours of supervised
- 20 clinical practice.
- 21 (b)(c) Prior to approval of an institute of acupuncture and related
- 22 techniques, the board shall determine that the institute meets standards of
- 23 professional education. These standards shall provide that the institute:
- 24 (1) Require, as a prerequisite to graduation, a program of study
- 25 of at least four (4) academic years;
- 26 (2) Meet the minimum requirements of a board-approved national
- 27 accrediting body;
- 28 (3) Require participation in a carefully supervised clinical or
- 29 internship program; and
- 30 (4) Confer a certificate, diploma, or degree in acupuncture and
- 31 related techniques only after personal attendance in classes and clinics.
- 32 (c) To qualify to take the examination, an applicant additionally
- 33 must:

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- (1) Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 35 (2) Be a citizen of the United States or a legal resident;
- 36 (3) Not have had a license to practice acupuncture and related

- 1 techniques in any other state suspended or revoked nor have been placed on
- 2 probation for any cause;
- 3 (4) Not have been convicted of a felony; and
- 4 (5) Not be a habitual user of intoxicants, drugs, or
- 5 hallucinatory preparations.
- 6 (d)(e) The board may charge the following fees:
- 7 (1) Initial application for licensing, a fee not to exceed two 8 hundred fifty dollars (\$250);
- 9 (2) Written and practical examination not including the cost of
- 10 the nationally recognized examination, a fee not to exceed three hundred
- 11 fifty dollars (\$350);
- 12 (3) Biennial licensing renewal, a fee not to exceed four hundred
- 13 dollars (\$400);
- 14 (4) Late renewal more than thirty (30) days, but not later than
- one (1) year, after expiration of a license, which late fee is in addition to
- 16 any other fees, a fee not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100);
- 17 (5) Reciprocal licensing, a fee not to exceed seven hundred
- 18 fifty dollars (\$750);
- 19 (6) Annual continuing education provider registration, a fee not
- 20 to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200); and
- 21 (7) Any and all fees to cover reasonable and necessary
- 22 administrative expenses.
- 23 $\frac{(e)(1)(A)}{(f)(1)}(A)$ If the applicant is approved, the applicant shall
- 24 be admitted for examination.
- 25 (B) Should the applicant pass the examination, no part of
- 26 the fee shall be returned, and the applicant shall be issued a license to
- 27 practice acupuncture and related techniques in accordance with this chapter.
- 28 (C) Should an applicant be approved but fail to appear for
- 29 the examination, no part of his or her fee shall be returned, but the
- 30 applicant shall be eligible for examination at a later date.
- 31 (D) Should the approved applicant fail the examination, no
- 32 part of his or her fee shall be returned, and the applicant shall be eligible
- 33 for reexamination at a later date, at the discretion of the board, upon
- 34 paying an examination fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per failed subject up to
- 35 one hundred fifty dollars (\$150).
- 36 (2) If the applicant is not approved, the application and one-
