12	4-112-103. Connect Arkansas - Nonprofit organization.
13	(a) The Arkansas Capitol Corporation may form a nonprofit corporation
14	named "Connect Arkansas" to:
15	(1) Prepare the people and businesses of Arkansas to secure the
16	economic, educational, health, social, and other benefits available via
17	broadband use; and
18	(2) Facilitate the availability of broadband service to every
19	home and business in Arkansas.
20	(b) The Arkansas Science and Technology Authority may make grants from
21	funds available for the purpose of establishing Connect Arkansas.
22	(c) Connect Arkansas will promote broadband-based development in
23	Arkansas, with the goals of facilitating:
24	(1) Broadband education so that the citizens of every home and
25	business in Arkansas can take full advantage of broadband services; and
26	(2) The availability of broadband service to broadband educated
27	citizens in every home and business in Arkansas by the end of the year 2012.
28	(d) Recognizing that such services as geographical information system
29	data delivery and high definition television programs require increasingly
30	huge demands in bandwidth, Connect Arkansas will promote broadband backbone
31	networks that will serve all of Arkansas with the bandwidth to support
32	Arkansas home and business needs into the foreseeable future.

34	4-112-104. Creation of the Arkansas Broadband Advisory Council.
35	(a) The Arkansas Broadband Advisory Council is created to:
36	(1) Monitor the broadband based development efforts of other

1	states and nations in areas such as business, education, and health; and			
2	(2) Advise the Governor and the General Assembly on policies			
3	related to making affordable broadband available to every Arkansas home and			
4	business.			
5	(b) The council shall include:			
6	(1) One (1) representative from each broadband provider			
7	association that exists in the state on the effective date of this chapter			
8	including without limitation the Arkansas Cable Telecommunications			
9	Association and the Arkansas Telecommunications Association;			
10	(2) Three (3) members to be appointed by the Governor;			
11	(3) Three (3) members to be appointed by the President Pro			
12	Tempore of the Arkansas Senate; and			
13	(4) Three (3) members to be appointed by the Speaker of the			
14	Arkansas House of Representatives.			
15	(c) The council shall:			
16	(1) Provide an annual report to the Governor and the General			
17	Assembly;			
18	(2) Provide a final report to the Governor and the General			
19	Assembly through the year ending December 31, 2011; and			
20	(3) Expire on June 30, 2012.

22	4-112-105. Broadband service registration.			
23	(a) Connect Arkansas will establish a method for broadband service			
24	providers to register areas in which they provide broadband service to enable			
25	Connect Arkansas to target locations where broadband is not currently offered			
26	to Arkansas homes and businesses.			
27	(b) Specific registration requirements will be established by Connect			
28	Arkansas, but competitive provider information shall be kept confidential by			
29	Connect Arkansas.			
30	(c) Connect Arkansas shall execute nondisclosure agreements with			
31	providers to guarantee confidentiality.			
32	(d) Connect Arkansas may disclose areas that are registered, the types			
33	of broadband available in registered areas, and any provider information that			
34	the provider identifies as acceptable for disclosure.			
35	(e) Registered areas are subject to verification by Connect Arkansas			
36	and by the affected counties, but competitive service provider information			

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
