11	RESOLUTION
12	IN RESPECTFUL MEMORY OF DR. JERRY DONAL JEWELL
13	AND IN RECOGNITION OF HIS MANY CONTRIBUTIONS TO
14	THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND HIS LOCAL COMMUNITY.

17	IN RESPECTFUL MEMORY OF DR. JERRY DONAL
18	JEWELL AND IN RECOGNITION OF HIS MANY
19	CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS
20	AND HIS LOCAL COMMUNITY.

23	WHEREAS, Dr. Jerry Donal Jewell of Little Rock, Arkansas, died on
24	August 17, 2002, at the age of seventy-one (71); and
25	
26	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell was born in Chatfield, Arkansas, on September 16,
27	1930, to Ruth and James M. Jewell; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell graduated from Shelby County Training School in
30	Lucy, Tennessee, in 1949; the former Agricultural, Mechanical, and Normal
31	College, now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, with a bachelor of
32	science degree in chemistry, a school he attended on an athletic scholarship;
33	and the School of Dentistry of Meharry Medical College in Nashville,
34	Tennessee, with a doctorate of dental surgery degree; and
35	
36	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell served as a dentist in the U.S. Army at Fort

1	Leonard Wood, Missouri, and served five (5) years in the Army Reserves; and
2	
3	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell was inspired to become a dentist by four (4)
4	uncles, three (3) of whom were physicians and one (1) who was a dentist in
5	the Memphis, Tennessee, area; joined a dental practice in North Little Rock,
6	Arkansas, in 1959; and shortly thereafter opened his own dental office in
7	Little Rock, Arkansas, where he worked until his death; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell was elected as a state senator for District 17 in
10	1972, a position he served in until 1993; was elected President Pro Tempore
11	of the Senate in 1992; and became the first African-American governor of the
12	State of Arkansas because of his service as acting governor whenever the
13	governor and lieutenant governor were out of state during his tenure as
14	President Pro Tempore; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, Dr. Jewell was president of the Little Rock Branch of the
17	NAACP from 1963 until 1967, of which he was a lifetime member; was president
18	of the Arkansas Conference of Branches — NAACP from 1965 until 1967; served
19	on the Little Rock Civil Service Commission from 1968 until 1972; served on
20	the National Democratic Party Credentials Commission in 1972; and served on
21	the National Democratic Party Charter Commission from 1972 until 1974; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Senator Irma Hunter Brown said Dr. Jewell always stressed to
24	fellow African-Americans the need for economic development, stating, "He
25	certainly worked to try to improve the economic level of those who he came in
26	contact with $\ldots$ . He was the kind of person who was extremely dedicated to
27	human rights, civil rights, and social justice."; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, the Senate of the Eighty-Sixth General Assembly wishes to
30	publicly recognize Dr. Jewell's contributions to the State of Arkansas and
31	his local community,
32	
33	NOW THEREFORE,
34	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
35	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
36	

1	That the Senate recognizes Dr. Jerry Donal Jewell's commitment, hard
2	work, dedication, and service to the State of Arkansas and his local
3	community and commends him for his leadership.
4	
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the individual members of the Senate hereby
6	express sincere condolences to the family of Dr. Jewell, and upon adoption of
7	this resolution, an appropriate copy shall be provided to the family of Dr.
8	Jewell by the Secretary of the Senate.
