6	others, played an integral role in the pioneering of the "Nashville Sound"
7	which revolutionized country music during the late 1950's and throughout the

10	WHEREAS, in 1959 the group's song "The Three Bells" spent ten (10)
11	weeks atop the country charts and four (4) weeks at number one on the pop
12	charts; and

16	Bandstand; and
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18	WHEREAS, The Browns joined the Grand Ole Opry in 1963; and
