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20	WHEREAS, Mr. Charles L. Robinson has served since 1973 in the Division
21	of Legislative Audit; served as the Administrator, Audit Supervisor, and
22	Field Auditor for the division from January 1973 until December 1977; served
23	as Assistant Legislative Auditor from January 1978 until June 1979; and in
24	July 1979 was named the Arkansas Legislative Auditor; and
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26	WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson's key accomplishments in twenty-seven (27) years
27	as Arkansas Legislative Auditor include:
28	(a) Promoted the professionalism of the staff, resulting in an
29	increase of Certified Public Accountants from twenty-three percent (23%) to
30	sixty-four percent (64%) of the division's audit staff;
31	(b) Encouraged staff membership, participation, and leadership in
32	various state, regional, and national organizations including the American
33 24	Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Arkansas Society of Certified
34 25	Public Accountants, the Southwest Intergovernmental Audit Forum, the National
35 26	Conference of State Legislatures, and the National Legislative Program
36	Evaluation Society;



(c) Increased staff productivity and efficiency by emphasizing
coordination and communication, providing advanced technology tools and
training, and locating employees to minimize travel time and associated costs
resulting in the more timely issuance of audit reports;

5 (d) Reallocated human resources to provide for expanded division 6 services, including performance audits, special reports, and investigative 7 reports to provide information to improve public accountability and 8 facilitate the legislative decision-making processes, therefore was able to 9 expand services without significant increases in staffing;

10 Encouraged and assisted the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee (e) 11 in sponsoring key legislation to improve internal controls, accounting, 12 procedures, records management, and ensure compliance with fiscal management for the state and its political subdivisions; such legislation included the 13 14 creation of a Self-Insured Fidelity Bond Program for state and local 15 governmental entity officials and employees, a uniform comprehensive county 16 financial management system, and a uniform accounting system for counties, 17 municipalities, and district courts;

18 (f) Enhanced communication with members of the General Assembly and 19 the general public by establishing a division website where over eight 20 hundred (800) reports issued annually are available for reference and public 21 inspection; and

(g) Directed the audit of the state's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for 2005 and 2006 and the statewide federal compliance audit since 2002; and

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WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson served as a Staff Accountant for KPMG Peat Marwick in Little Rock, Arkansas, from July 1968 until May 1970; joined the University of Arkansas as an accounting instructor in June 1970 and taught until December 1972; and then the State of Arkansas was fortunate enough that Mr. Robinson chose to join the Division of Legislative Audit; and

32 WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson received his Bachelor of Science degree in 33 Accounting from Arkansas Tech University in 1968 before going on to earn a 34 Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Arkansas in 35 1971; and

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WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson is a Certified Public Accountant, having passed the exam in 1970, and became a Certified Fraud Examiner in 1991; and is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners, the Arkansas Society of Certified Public Accountants, the National Conference of State Legislatures, and the Southwest Intergovernmental Audit Forum, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: THAT the Senate commends Mr. Charles L. Robinson for his leadership and recognizes his contributions to the State of Arkansas and the Division of Legislative Audit. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate copy shall be provided to Mr. Robinson by the Secretary of the Senate.
