Duration of sessions. 7 The regular biennial annual sessions shall not exceed sixty days in 8 duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each house 9 of said the General Assembly. This section shall not apply to the first session of the General Assembly under this Constitution, or when impeachments 10 11 are pending. 12 13 SECTION 3. Section 29 of Article 5, of the Arkansas Constitution is 14 amended to read as follows: 29. Appropriations. 15 16 (a) No money shall be drawn from the treasury except in pursuance of 17 specific appropriation made by law, the purpose of which shall be distinctly stated in the bill, and the maximum amount which may be drawn shall be 18 19 specified in dollars and cents; and no appropriations shall be for a longer period than two years. An appropriation bill enacted in a regular session of 20 21 the General Assembly in an even-numbered year shall not extend beyond the 22 biennial period in which the bill is enacted. 2.3 (b) As used in this constitution, "biennial period" means July 1 of an 24 odd-numbered year through June 30 of the next odd-numbered year. 25 26 SECTION 4. Section 40 of Article 5 of the Arkansas Constitution is 27 amended to read as follows: 28 40. General appropriation bill - Enactment. 29 § 4. (a) In making appropriations for any biennial period, the General 30 Assembly shall first pass the General Appropriation Bill provided for in 31 Section 30 of Article 5 of the Constitution, and no other appropriation bill 32 may be enacted before that shall have been done. 33 (b)(1) If the General Appropriation Bill enacted during a regular 34 session held in an odd-numbered year is effective for both fiscal years of 35 the biennium, then in the regular session held in an even-numbered year, the

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General Assembly is not required to enact a General Appropriation Bill before

1	other appropriation bills may be enacted for the second year of the biennium.
2	(2) If the General Appropriation Bill enacted during a regular
3	session held in an odd-numbered year is effective only for the first fiscal
4	year of the biennium, then during a regular session held in the subsequent
5	even-numbered year, the General Appropriation Bill for the second year of the
6	biennium must be enacted before any other appropriation bill may be enacted.
