34 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE 35 STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL 36 MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election for Senators and Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:

9 SECTION 1. Section 1 of Article 3 of the Arkansas Constitution is 10 amended to read as follows:

11

§ 1. Qualifications of electors - Equal suffrage - Poll tax.

12 Every citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one years, who 13 has resided in the State twelve months, in the county six months, and in the 14 precinct, town or ward one month, next preceding any election at which they 15 may propose to vote, except such persons as may for the commission of some 16 felony be deprived of the right to vote by law passed by the General 17 Assembly, and who shall exhibit a poll tax receipt or other evidence that they have paid their poll tax at the time of collecting taxes next preceding 18 19 such election, shall be allowed to vote at any election in the State of 20 Arkansas, provided, that persons who make satisfactory proof that they have 21 attained the age of twenty one years since the time of assessing taxes next 22 preceding said election and possess the other necessary qualifications, shall 23 be permitted to vote; and, provided, further, that the said tax receipt shall 24 be so marked by dated stamp or written endorsement by the judges of election 25 to whom it may be first presented as to prevent the holder thereof from 26 voting more than once at any election. It is declared to be the purpose of 27 this amendment to deny the right of suffrage to aliens and it is declared to 28 be the purpose of this amendment to confer suffrage equally upon both men and 29 women, without regard to sex; provided, that women shall not be compelled to 30 serve on juries. [As amended by Const. Amend. 8.] Except as otherwise 31 provided by this Constitution, any person may vote in an election in this 32 <u>state wh</u>o is: 33 (1) A citizen of the United States; 34 (2) A resident of the State of Arkansas;

35 (3)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (3)(B) of this section,

36 <u>at least eighteen (18) years of age.</u>

1 (B) At a primary election, any person who will have 2 attained the age of eighteen (18) years on or before the date of the next general election is entitled to vote at the primary election; and 3 4 (4) Lawfully registered to vote in the election. 5 6 SECTION 2. Section 2 of Article 3 of the Arkansas Constitution is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 § 2. Right of suffrage. 9 Elections shall be free and equal. No power, civil or military, shall ever interfere to prevent the free exercise of the right of suffrage; nor 10 11 shall any law be enacted, whereby the right to vote at any election shall be 12 made to depend upon any previous registration of the elector's name; or whereby such right shall be impaired or forfeited, except for the commission 13 of a felony at common law, upon lawful conviction thereof. 14 15 16 SECTION 3. Section 5 of Article 3 is repealed. 17 § 5. Idiots and insane persons No idiot or insane person shall be entitled to the privileges of an 18 19 elector 20 21 SECTION 4. Section 8 of Article 3 of the Arkansas Constitution is 2.2 amended to read as follows: 23 § 8. Time of holding elections. 24 The general elections shall be held biennially, on the first Monday of 25 September; but the General Assembly may, by law, fix a different time the 26 days and at times fixed by the General Assembly. 27 SECTION 5. Section 10 of Article 3 of the Arkansas Constitution is 28 29 amended to read as follows: 30 § 10. Election officers. 31 No person shall be qualified to serve as an election officer who shall 32 hold, at the time of the election, any office, appointment, or employment in 33 or under the government of the United States, or of this State, or in any 34 city or county or any municipal board, commission or trust in any city, save 35 only the justices of the peace, and aldermen, notaries public and persons in the militia service of the State. Nor shall any election officer be eligible 36

1	to any civil office to be filled at an election at which he shall serve save
2	only to such subordinate municipal or local offices, below the grade of city
3	or county officers, as shall be designated by general law The General
4	Assembly shall determine the qualifications of an election officer.
