16	WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., is the oldest Greek letter
17	organization for African American women in the world; has a theme of
18	providing "service to all mankind"; is composed of over one hundred eighty-
19	five thousand (185,000) college-trained women from around the world, with an
20	active membership of over forty-nine thousand (49,000) diverse women; and
21	members have included educators, heads of state, politicians, lawyers,
22	medical professionals, media personalities, and decision-makers in major
23	corporations; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, well-known honorary members of Alpha Kappa Alpha include
26	Marian Anderson, Maya Angelou, Ella Fitzgerald, Mae Jernison, Coretta Scott
27	King, Judge Constance Baker Motley; and local and state-wide members include
28	Judge Andree Layton Roaf, Senator Irma Hunter Brown, Representative Nancy
29 30	Blount, Representative Linda Chesterfield, and Representative Wilhelmina
31	Lewellen; and
32	WHEREAS, locally the Beta Pi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha in
33	Little Rock, Arkansas, is known for its philanthropic work in the areas of
34	education, the arts, economic development, and health; and has provided ten
35	thousand dollars (\$10,000) in scholarships each year to college-bound young
36	women in the Central Arkansas area; and

2	WHEREAS, internationally Alpha Kappa Alpha responds to the contemporary
3	needs of the black community with comprehensive nontraditional programs; and
4	the Alpha Kappa Alpha Centennial International President has set forth five
5	(5) platforms for programs for the next biennium, including "Non-Traditional
6	Entrepreneur", "Economic Keys to Success", "Economic Growth of the Black
7	Family", "Undergraduate Signature Program: Economic Educational Advancement
8	Through Technology", and "Health Resource Management and Economics"; and

10	WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Day is historically observed during each
11	regular legislative session, and members are recognized for the sea of pink
12	and green-attired women who converge upon the State Capitol wearing these
13	sorority colors; the day includes a program attended by Arkansas's
14	constitutional officers, elected officials, and sorority members from across
15	the state; and members attend committee meetings to stay abreast of issues
16	before the General Assembly,

18	NOW THEREFORE,
19	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
20	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
