23	WHEREAS, there is cause to evaluate needed reforms of the state's		
24	juvenile justice system to more effectively and efficiently serve youth		
25	committed to the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Health	and	
26	Human Services and to identify best practices that will reduce unnecessa	iry	
27	reliance on large juvenile correctional facilities and promote the		
28	development of an appropriate continuum of community-based treatment		
29	alternatives in the least restrictive settings possible consistent with		
30	public safety; and

32	WHEREAS, an interim study proposal is required for the retention o	of	
33	independent expert consultants to assist the Division of Youth Services	of	
34	the Department of Health and Human Services to conduct comprehensive nee	eds	
35	and risk assessments of juveniles incarcerated at the Alexander Juvenile	ý	
36	Correctional Facility and other facilities of the Division of Youth Serv	vice	s



of the Department of Health and Human Services to identify gaps in existing community-based alternative placements and services necessary to more effectively and efficiently serve juveniles committed to the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Health and Human Services in the least restrictive settings possible consistent with public safety; and

7 WHEREAS, there is a pressing need to develop a juvenile justice reform 8 plan by no later than twelve (12) months from the effective date of this 9 interim study proposal that incorporates the evaluations, assessments, and 10 recommendations of the independent experts provided for by this interim study 11 proposal and other stakeholders, including the Juvenile Justice Center of the 12 University of Arkansas at Little Rock, the Department of Education, the Division of Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services, 13 14 the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the Department of 15 Health and Human Services, Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families, the 16 Arkansas Disability Rights Center, the Juvenile Ombudsman Division of the 17 Public Defender Commission, the Division of Children and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Services, the Administrative Offices of 18 19 the Courts, and families and youth; and

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21 WHEREAS, there exists an urgent need for construction, renovation, 22 acquisition, purchase of equipment, maintenance, and other operating expenses 23 to implement the reform plan provided for in this interim study proposal and 24 to replace the facilities where conditions of confinement support ceasing 25 operation with facilities that meet contemporary juvenile justice national 26 best practices. These treatment services, programs, and centers shall 27 incorporate best practices for the provision of rehabilitative and other 28 services for juveniles and be consistent with applicable standards of 29 accreditation from the American Correctional Association, 30

31 NOW THEREFORE,

32 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE 33 STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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35 THAT the Senate requests that the Senate Interim Committee on Children 36 and Youth and the House Interim Committee on Aging, Children and Youth,

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Legislative and Military Affairs study ways to improve the state's juvenile
justice system for youth committed to the Division of Youth Services of the
Department of Health and Human Services.
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
