19	WHEREAS, Dr. Charles D. Dunn is retiring as President of Henderson
20	State University on June 30, 2008; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn has served twenty-two (22) years as President of
23	Henderson State University and, as the fourteenth president of the
24	university, has served longer than any of his predecessors; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn earned his Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from
27	Southern Arkansas University, his Masters of Arts in Government from the
28	University of North Texas, and his Ph.D. in Political Science from Southern
29	Illinois University in Carbondale; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn served in various roles at the University of Arkansas
32	at Monticello and the University of Central Arkansas before his appointment
33	as President of Henderson State University in 1986; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, when he retires on June 30, 2008, Dr. Dunn will have granted
36	seventy-six (76) associate degrees, nine thousand five hundred forty-three



1	(9,543) bachelor's degrees, two thousand one hundred seventy-three (2,173)
2	master's degrees, and thirteen (13) specialist degrees; and

4	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn has steered Henderson State University though many
5	dramatic changes since 1986, including numerous building and renovation
6	projects that have changed the face of the campus and a stronger academic
7	focus that led to the success of an Honors College, membership in the
8	prestigious Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges, and accreditation by the
9	American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn has assumed numerous leadership roles focused on
12	advancing higher education in the State of Arkansas and the United States,
13	including serving as chair of the Executive Council of the Arkansas
14	Presidents and Chancellors, a member of the Arkansas Department of Higher
15	Education Steering Council for Higher Education Priorities, a member of the
16	Arkansas Blue Ribbon Commission on Public Education, chair of the Arkansas
17	Higher Education Council, and president of the Council of Public Liberal Arts
18	Colleges; and

20	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn is married to Dr. Jane Dunn and they have four (4)
21	children, three (3) granddaughters and one (1) grandson; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Dr. Dunn's outstanding tenure at Henderson State and his
24	countless contributions to higher education in the state are greatly
25	appreciated and will not soon be forgotten,

27	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL
28	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
