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## For An Act To Be Entitled

12 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE TASK FORCE ON THE EFFECT  
13 OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE IN ARKANSAS; AND FOR OTHER  
14 PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

17 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE TASK FORCE ON  
18 THE EFFECT OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE IN  
19 ARKANSAS.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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#### SECTION 1. Findings.

25 The General Assembly finds that:

26 (1) Alzheimer's disease is a progressive and fatal brain disease  
27 that destroys brain cells and causes problems with memory, thinking, and  
28 behavior;

29 (2) More than five million (5,000,000) Americans now have  
30 Alzheimer's disease;

31 (3) Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia and  
32 is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States; and

33 (4) No cure exists for Alzheimer's disease, but treatments for  
34 symptoms used in conjunction with appropriate services and support can  
35 improve the quality of life for those living with the disease.  
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1           SECTION 2. Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas  
2 -- Created -- Membership.

3           (a) There is created the Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's  
4 Disease in Arkansas to consist of seventeen (17) members as follows:

5                 (1) Four (4) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
6 Representatives as follows:

7                         (A) One (1) member of the House of Representatives;

8                         (B) One (1) member who has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's  
9 disease;

10                        (C) One (1) member to represent the health care provider  
11 community; and

12                        (D) One (1) member to represent the adult day services  
13 industry;

14                 (2) Four (4) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of  
15 the Senate as follows:

16                         (A) One (1) member of the Senate;

17                         (B) One (1) member who is a paid caregiver of a person  
18 with Alzheimer's disease;

19                         (C) One (1) member to represent the assisted living  
20 industry; and

21                         (D) One (1) member who is a scientist who specializes in  
22 Alzheimer's research;

23                 (3) Four (4) members appointed by the Governor as follows:

24                         (A) One (1) member who is a family member of a person  
25 living with Alzheimer's disease or other form of dementia;

26                         (B) One (1) member to represent the nursing facility  
27 industry;

28                         (C) One (1) member who is a person active in the state  
29 chapter of the Alzheimer's Association; and

30                         (D) One (1) member who is a person active in the state  
31 chapter of Alzheimer's Arkansas Programs and Services; and

32                 (4) Five (5) members as follows:

33                         (A) The Director of the Department of Health or his or her  
34 designee;

35                         (B) The Director of the Department of Human Services or  
36 his or her designee;

1                   (C) The Director of the Division of Behavioral Health of  
2 the Department of Human Services or his or her designee;

3                   (D) The Director of the Arkansas Center for Health  
4 Improvement or his or her designee; and

5                   (E) The Director of the Department of Workforce Services  
6 or his or her designee.

7           (b) The members of the task force shall be appointed by June 30, 2009.

8           (c)(1) Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of their  
9 appointing authorities.

10           (2) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the original  
11 appointing authority.

12           (d)(1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President  
13 Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each designate a co-chair from among the  
14 members of the task force.

15           (2) The cochairs shall jointly call the first meeting of the  
16 task force.

17           (e) A majority vote of the members present is required for any action  
18 of the task force.

19           (f) Task force meetings shall be held in Pulaski County, Arkansas, and  
20 at other locations in the state as the task force shall deem necessary.

21           (g) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall provide staff support to  
22 the task force as necessary to assist the task force in the performance of  
23 its duties.

24           (h) Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed for  
25 expenses and per diem at the same rate and from the same source as provided  
26 by law for members of the General Assembly attending meetings of the interim  
27 committees.

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29           SECTION 3. Duties.

30           (a) The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas  
31 shall:

32           (1) Assess the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease  
33 and other types of dementia on the residents of the State of Arkansas;

34           (2) Examine the existing industries, services, and resources  
35 addressing the needs of persons living with Alzheimer's disease, their  
36 families, and caregivers; and

1           (3) Develop a strategy to mobilize a state response to the  
2 public health crisis created by Alzheimer's disease and other types of  
3 dementia.

4           (b) The task force shall include the following in its assessments and  
5 recommendations:

6           (1) Statewide trends in the number of persons living with  
7 Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia and the needs of those  
8 persons;

9           (2) The state's role in providing long-term care, family  
10 caregiver support, and other forms of assistance to persons with early-stage  
11 and younger onset of Alzheimer's disease;

12           (3) State policy regarding persons with Alzheimer's disease and  
13 developmental disabilities;

14           (4) Existing services, resources, and capacity, including  
15 without limitation:

16                   (A) The type, cost, and availability of dementia services;

17                   (B) The dementia-specific training requirements for long-  
18 term care staff;

19                   (C) Quality care measures for residential care facilities;

20                   (D) The capacity of public safety and law enforcement  
21 agencies to respond to persons with Alzheimer's disease;

22                   (E) The availability of home-based and community-based  
23 resources for persons with Alzheimer's disease, including the availability of  
24 respite care for families;

25                   (F) An inventory of long-term care dementia care units;

26                   (G) The adequacy and appropriateness of geriatric-  
27 psychiatric units for persons with behavioral disorders associated with  
28 Alzheimer's and related dementia;

29                   (H) The assisted living residential options for persons  
30 with dementia; and

31                   (I) State support for Alzheimer's research; and

32           (5) Needed state policies or responses, including without  
33 limitation:

34                   (A) Directions for the provision of clear and coordinated  
35 services and supports for persons and families living with Alzheimer's and  
36 related disorders; and

1                   (B) Strategies for addressing identified gaps in services.

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3           SECTION 4. Reports.

4           (a) The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas  
5 shall present a draft of assessments and recommendations for meeting the  
6 Alzheimer's disease needs in the State of Arkansas to the House and Senate  
7 Interim Committees on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor on or before October  
8 25, 2010.

9           (b) The task force shall issue a final report of its assessments and  
10 recommendations for meeting the Alzheimer's disease needs in the State of  
11 Arkansas to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public Health,  
12 Welfare, and Labor and the Governor on or before January 15, 2011.

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14           SECTION 5. The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in  
15 Arkansas shall expire on January 15, 2011.
