Arkansas Code § 7-5-409(f), concerning materials furnished 9 to qualified voters, is amended to read as follows: A designated bearer shall be allowed to pick up only two (2) 10 11 absentee ballots from the county clerk only during the fifteen (15) days 12 prior to a school election, special election, preferential primary election, presidential preferential primary election, or general election and seven (7) 13 days prior to a runoff election, including a general primary election. 14 15 16 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-8-101 is amended to read as follows: 17 7-8-101. Primaries — General law governs. (a) All primaries, preferential and general, for the selection of 18 19 nominees for federal offices, including those of the United States Senators and Representatives, shall be held on the same date and in the same manner as 20 21 the preferential and general primaries for state, district, county, and 22 township offices and shall be governed by the same procedure prescribed by 23 this act. 24 (b) Unless otherwise provided by Arkansas law, the presidential 25 preferential primary election shall be on the date established by the General 26 Assembly and shall be governed in accordance with the laws for primary 27 elections in this state. 28 29 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 7-8-201 is amended to read as follows: 30 7-8-201. Preferential elections required - Apportionment of delegates. (a)(1) Each political party in the state desiring to select delegates 31 32 to attend a quadrennial national nominating convention of the party to select

32	Choosing and election of electors of President and Vice President of

34	(1)(A) In each year in which a President and Vice President of
35	the United States are chosen, each political party or group in the state
36	shall choose by its state convention electors of President and Vice President

of the United States. The state convention of the party or group shall also choose electors at large if any are to be appointed for the state.

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- (B) The state convention of the party or group, by its chair and secretary, shall certify to the Secretary of State the total list of electors together with electors at large so chosen. The certificate shall be filed no later than September 15 in the year of the election. The filing of the certificate with the Secretary of State shall be deemed and taken to be the choosing and selection of the electors of this state, if the party or group is successful at the polls, as provided in this subchapter, in choosing their candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.
- (C) The certification by the respective political parties or groups in this state of electors of President and Vice President shall be made to the Secretary of State within two (2) days after the state convention:
- (2)(A) Should more than one (1) certificate of choice and selection of electors of the same political party or group be filed by contesting conventions or contesting groups, it shall be the duty of the constitutional officers of this state within ten (10) days after the adjournment of the last of the conventions to meet in the office of the Governor and determine which set of nominees for electors of the party or group was chosen and selected by the authorized convention of the party or group.
- 23 (B) The Secretary of State shall notify the state officers 24 of the date, time, and place of the meeting.
  - (C)(i) At the meeting, a majority of the officers present, after notice to the chair and secretaries or managers of the conventions or groups and after a hearing, shall determine which set of electors was chosen by the authorized convention and shall so announce and publish that fact.
- (ii) The decision shall be final, and the set of electors determined by the state officers to be chosen shall be the list or set of electors to be deemed elected if that party shall be <u>is</u> successful at the polls, as herein provided;
- 33 (3) Should a vacancy occur in the choice of an elector, the 34 vacancy may be filled by the state executive committee of the party or group, 35 to be certified by the committee to the Secretary of State;
- 36 (4)(A) The names of the candidates of the several political

1 parties or groups for electors of President and Vice President shall not be

- 2 printed on the official ballot to be voted on in the election to be held on
- 3 the day provided in § 7-8-301. In lieu of the names of the candidates for
- 4 electors, the name of the candidate for President and the name of the
- 5 candidate for Vice President with the particular political party designation
- 6 of each shall be printed on the ballot. Each voter in this state may choose
- 7 and elect one (1) list or set of electors from the several lists or sets of
- 8 electors chosen and selected by the respective political parties or groups,
- 9 by placing an appropriate mark on the ballot.

- 26 petition process may nominate by convention if the presidential election is
- 27 the first general election after certification as a party by the Secretary of
- 28 State.
- 29 (B) A political group desiring to have the names of its
- 30 candidates for President and Vice President printed on the ballot shall file
- 31 a petition with the Secretary of State by noon on the first Monday of August
- 32 of the year of the election. The petition shall contain at the time of filing
- 33 the names of one thousand (1,000) qualified electors of the state declaring
- 34 their desire to have printed on the ballot the names of their candidate for
- 35 President and Vice President. The Secretary of State shall verify the
- 36 sufficiency of the petition within ten (10) days from the filing of the

1 petition. If the petition is determined to be insufficient, the Secretary of 2 State shall notify in writing the political group through its designated 3 agent and shall set forth his or her reasons for so finding. 4 (C) Any challenges to the certification of the Secretary 5 of State shall be filed in the Pulaski County Circuit Court. 6 (D) By September 1 in the year of the election, a 7 political group that qualifies by petition to place its candidate on the 8 ballot shall submit a certificate of choice stating the names of its 9 candidates for President and Vice President, signed under oath by either the chair, vice chair, or secretary of the political group's convention. 10 11 (E) By September 15 in the year of the election, a 12 political group which qualifies by petition to place its candidate on the ballot shall submit a certificate of choice stating the names of its 13 candidates for President and Vice President, signed under oath by either the 14 15 chair, vice chair, or secretary of the political group's convention; and 16 (6)(A) Persons desiring to have their names printed on the 17 ballot as independent candidates for President and Vice President shall file a petition with the Secretary of State by noon on the first Monday of August 18 19 of the year of the election. The petition shall contain at the time of filing the names of one thousand (1,000) qualified electors of the state declaring 20 21 their desire to have printed on the ballot the names of the persons desiring 22 their names to be printed on the ballot as independent candidates for 23 President and Vice President. The Secretary of State shall verify the 24 sufficiency of the petition within ten (10) days from the filing of the 25 petition. If the petition is determined to be insufficient, the Secretary of 26 State shall notify in writing the persons desiring to have their names 27 printed on the ballot as independent candidates for President and Vice 28 President at the address or telephone number submitted with the petition and shall set forth his or her reasons for so finding. 29 30 (B) Any challenges to the certification of the Secretary 31 of State shall be filed in the Pulaski County Circuit Court. 32 (C) By September 1 in the year of the election, 33 independent candidates who qualify by petition to be on the ballot shall 34 certify to the Secretary of State the total list of electors together with electors at large. The filing of the certificate with the Secretary of State 35
