## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO ALLOW THE INCIDENTAL SALE OF WHOLE MILK  
10 THAT IS NOT *PASTEURIZED*; TO ALLOW THE STATE BOARD  
11 OF HEALTH TO MAKE RULES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

14 TO ALLOW THE INCIDENTAL SALE OF WHOLE  
15 MILK THAT IS NOT PASTEURIZED AND TO  
16 ALLOW THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO MAKE  
17 RULES FOR THE SALE OF WHOLE MILK THAT IS  
18 NOT PASTEURIZED.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
23

24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-59-248 is amended to read as follows:  
25 20-59-248. Incidental sales of goat milk and whole milk that has not  
26 been pasteurized are not prohibited.

27 (a) For purposes of this section,:

28 (1) "incidental sales of goat milk" "Incidental sales" are those  
29 sales where the average monthly number of gallons sold does not exceed one  
30 hundred (100) gallons; and

31 (2) "Whole milk" has the same meaning as it is defined in § 20-  
32 59-201.

33 (b) The provisions of this subchapter shall not be construed to  
34 prohibit incidental sales of raw goat milk or whole milk that has not been  
35 pasteurized directly to consumers at the farm where the milk is produced or  
36 *to preclude the advertising of those incidental sales of goat milk.*
