In order to meet these public needs, it is essential that public financing be provided for the facilities. It is the purpose of this chapter to provide an alternative method of financing for the facilities.

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8 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 14-137-106(d), concerning the definition of 9 "other capital improvement facilities", is amended to read as follows:

As used in this section, the term "other capital improvement 10 (d) 11 facilities" means, whether obtained by purchase, lease, construction, 12 reconstruction, restoration, improvement, alteration, repair, or other means, any physical public betterment or improvement or any preliminary plans, 13 14 studies, or surveys relative thereto; lands or rights in land, including, 15 without limitations, leases, air rights, easements, rights-of-way, or 16 licenses; furnishings, machinery, vehicles, apparatus, equipment, or other 17 personal property for use by the city or county; and any furnishings, machinery, vehicles, apparatus, or equipment for any public betterment or 18 19 improvement, which shall include, without limiting the generality of the 20 foregoing, the following:

(1) Any and all facilities Facilities for city or town halls,
 courthouses, and administrative, executive, or other public offices;
