Employment of certified personnel. 14 (a) Except as prohibited under subsections (c) and (d) of this 15 section, school boards of directors may employ superintendents, deputy 16 superintendents, assistant superintendents, and high school principals, as 17 well as department heads, coaches, teachers, and other certified personnel, 18 by written contract for a period of time not more than three (3) years. 19 The contracts may be renewed annually. 20 Beginning on July 16, 2003, through July 1, 2004, notwithstanding 21 any other provision of law except for currently binding contractual 22 obligations or enforceable court-ordered mandates, no public school board of 23 directors or the governing board of an education service cooperative or 24 charter school may employ or extend the employment contract of any 25 superintendent, assistant superintendent, school principal, department head, 26 coach, teacher, or other certified or noncertified personnel for a period of 27 time more than one (1) fiscal year without the prior written approval of the 28 State Board of Education or the Commissioner of Education as allowed in 29 emergency situations. 30 (d) No employment contract or extension to an employment contract 31 entered on or after July 16, 2003, through July 1, 2004, may have a combined 32 total increase in salaries, income, and benefits of greater than seven and 33 one-half percent (7.5%) of the immediate previous existing contract for the

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same or substantially similar personnel position without the prior written
