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SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-18-601(c), concerning the medical certification, is amended to read as follows: 3

4 (c)(1)(A) The medical certification shall be completed, signed, and returned to the funeral director within two (2) business days after receipt 5 6 of the death certificate by the physician in charge of the patient's care for 7 the illness or condition which that resulted in death, except when inquiry is required by § 12-12-315, § 12-12-318, or § 14-15-301 et seq. 8

9 (2) (B) In the absence of the physician, or with his or her 10 approval, the certificate may be completed and signed by his or her associate 11 physician, by the chief medical officer of the institution in which death occurred, by the pathologist who performed an autopsy upon the decedent, or 12 by a registered nurse as provided in this subsection (c)(2) of this section, 13 provided if the individual has access to the medical history of the case, 14 15 views the deceased at or after death, and has reviewed the coroner's report 16 if required and if the death is due to natural causes. The person individual 17 completing the cause-of-death section of the certificate shall attest to its accuracy either by a signature or by approved electronic process. 18

(2) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall enforce by rule 19 20 subdivision (c)(1) of this section concerning the time period in which the 21 medical certification shall be executed.

22 (3) A registered nurse employed by the attending hospice may complete and sign the medical certification of death and pronounce death for 23 24 a patient who is terminally ill, whose death is anticipated, who is receiving 25 services from a hospice program certified under § 20-7-117, and who dies in a 26 hospice inpatient program or as a hospice patient in a nursing home.

27 (4) If the hospice patient dies in the home, the registered 28 nurse may make pronouncement of death. However, the county coroner and the 29 chief law enforcement official of the county or municipality where death occurred shall be immediately notified in accordance with § 12-12-315. 30

31 (5) The Department of Health shall provide hospitals, nursing 32 homes, and hospices with the appropriate death certificate forms, which will 33 be made available to the attending physicians, coroners, or other certifiers certifier of death. When death occurs outside these health facilities, the 34 35 funeral home shall provide the death certificate to the certifier of death. 36
