SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. 1 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 2 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 3 4 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 5 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 6 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 7 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 8 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 9 10 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 11 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 12 13 effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this 14 15 Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular 16 Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its 17 passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, 18 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the 19 20 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in 21 full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. 22 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become 23 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.
