32	(a) It is the inte	ent of the General Assembly:			
33	(1) To assist growing, technology-based enterprises by:

8	Engineering Grant Program shall benefit the State of Arkansas as a whole and
9	that provisions be made to ensure that all parts of the state have an
10	opportunity to benefit from this subchapter.

12	15-3-402. Application for funding.
13	(a) The Arkansas Science and Technology Authority shall make available
14	forms upon which a business eligible for a grant under § 15-3-403 may apply
15	for a grant to support the hiring of post-doctoral science and engineering
16	graduates to work in areas of their expertise in Arkansas.
17	(b) Within thirty (30) days of the receipt of an application, the
18	Arkansas Science and Technology Authority shall notify the applicant whether:
19	(1) The applicant meets the criteria for benefits; and
20	(2) Funds are available to assist the business in the hiring of
21	post-doctoral science and engineering graduates.

23	15-3-403. Eligibility for grants.
24	To qualify for a grant authorized under § 15-3-404, a business shall:
25	(1) Have operations within the State of Arkansas that are in one
26	(1) of the six (6) categories of targeted businesses identified in § 15-4-

28	(2) Pay average hourly wages in excess of one hundred and ten
29	percent (110%) of the county or state average hourly wage, whichever is less;

32	taxpayer and a resident of the State of Arkansas.

30	(a) The Arkansas Science and Technology Authority, through the
31	promulgation of rules in accordance with the Arkansas Administrative
32	Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq., shall establish procedures, consistent
33	with this subchapter, to carry out the intent of this legislation.
34	(b) The authority shall establish by rule opportunities for assisting
35	in the hiring of post-doctoral graduates in each of the four (4)
36	congressional districts in the state.
