24	13-14-101. Short title.	
25	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Heritage Trails Systems".	.em
26	Act".	
27		
28	13-14-102. Legislative intent.	
29	The purpose of this act is to:	
30	(1) Provide for the increasing outdoor recreational needs of the	<u>he</u>
31	State of Arkansas;	
32	(2) Promote the preservation of, public access to, travel	
33	within, and enjoyment and appreciation of the open-air, outdoor areas and	
34	historic resources of the state; and	
35	(3) Recognize the valuable contributions that volunteers and	<u>.</u>
36	private, nonprofit trail groups have made to the development and maintenance	e

1	of historic trails by encouraging and assisting volunteer citizen involvement
2	in the planning, development, maintenance, and management of trails.
3	
4	13-14-103. Arkansas heritage trails.
5	(a) A heritage trail shall:
6	(1)(A) Be a trail or route established by historic use and shall
7	be historically significant as a result of that historic use.
8	(B) A route shall not be required to exist as a
9	discernible trail to qualify as a heritage trail, but its location shall be
10	sufficiently known to permit evaluation of historical interest potential;
11	(2)(A) Accurately follow the historic route with some deviations
12	as necessary to avoid difficult routing through subsequent development or to
13	enhance the public's enjoyment of the heritage trail.
14	(B) Trail segments no longer possible to travel by trail
15	due to subsequent development as motorized transportation routes may be
16	designated and marked as segments that link to the historic trail;
17	(3) Be of state or national significance to Arkansas or American
18	history, including without limitation trade, commerce, exploration,
19	migration, settlement, or military campaigns;
20	(4) Have a far-reaching effect on broad patterns of American
21	culture, including trails significant to the history of American Indians; and
22	(5)(A) Have significant potential for public recreational use or
23	historical interest based on historical interpretation and appreciation,
24	including roadless segments developed as historic trails and at historic
25	sites associated with the trail.
26	(B) The presence of recreation potential unrelated to
27	historic appreciation is not sufficient for designation as a heritage trail.
28	(b)(1) A heritage trail shall follow as closely as possible and
29	practicable the original trails or routes of travel of state historic
30	significance.
31	(2) The purpose of a heritage trail is the identification and
32	protection of the historic route and its historic remnants and artifacts for
33	public use and enjoyment.
34	(c) A land-based or water-based component of a historic trail that is
35	on state-owned land and meets the criteria for a heritage trail shall be
36	included as a state-protected component of a heritage trail

1	(d) The Department of Parks and Tourism shall:
2	(1) Administer the provisions of this act; and
3	(2) Establish a uniform marker for the Arkansas heritage trails
4	system.
5	
6	13-14-104. Designation of heritage trails.
7	(a) The General Assembly shall identify the trails or categories of
8	trails that are part of the heritage trails system.
9	(b) The following are designated as heritage trails:
10	(1) Butterfield Stage Route, a bifurcated route from the
11	Missouri state line near Pea Ridge, Arkansas, to the Oklahoma state line near
12	Fort Smith and from Memphis to Fort Smith;
13	(2) The Southwest Trail from the Missouri border to the Texas
14	border;
15	(3) American Indian removal routes designated by the Department
16	of Parks and Tourism, including without limitation land and water routes for
17	Cherokee, Choctaw, Muscogee (Creek), Chickasaw, and Seminole tribes; and
18	(4) Civil War troop movement routes designated by the
19	department.
20	
21	13-14-105. Studies of prospective heritage trails.
22	(a) The Department of Parks and Tourism, in consultation with the
23	Arkansas History Commission, the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program, and
24	the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, shall conduct
25	studies to determine the feasibility of designating additional trails as
26	heritage trails.
27	(b) Studies under this section shall include without limitation:
28	(1) The proposed route of the trail;
29	(2) The areas adjacent to the trail to be utilized for historic
30	purposes;
31	(3) The characteristics making the trail worthy of designation
32	as a state heritage trail and its historic significance;
33	(4) The current ownership status of the land and the current and
34	potential use of the designated route;
35	(5) The plans for developing and maintaining the trail and the
36	potential cost; and

1	(6) The anticipated impact of public outdoor recreation use on
2	the preservation of the prospective heritage trail.
3	(c) The following routes shall be studied by the Department of Parks
4	and Tourism to determine the feasibility and desirability of designating
5	other trails as heritage trails:
6	(1) The Line Road from Van Buren to Evansville;
7	(2) The Memphis to Little Rock Road;
8	(3) The Rock Roe Landing connection to the Memphis to Little
9	Rock Road from where Rock Roe enters the White River to the Memphis to Little
10	Rock Road;
11	(4) The Cadron to Arkansas Post Road;
12	(5) The Little Rock to Fort Smith Road section to Potts old
13	place north of Potts Tavern;
14	(6) The Little Rock to Fort Smith and Fort Gibson section from
15	Potts to Fort Smith crossing the Arkansas River at Dardanelle;
16	(7) The Upper Cut road;
17	(8) The Little Rock to Washington road;
18	(9) The Old Fort Towson road from Washington to American Indian
19	territory;
20	(10) The Antoine to Fort Towson Road;
21	(11) The Ecore Fabre to Washington Route; and
22	(12 The Ecore Fabre to Point Chicot Road.
