19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 12-9-104, concerning the powers of the
22 Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, is amended to
23 add additional subdivisions to read as follows:

24 (15) In consultation with the Arkansas Association of Chiefs of
25 Police, develop and implement suggested selection and training requirements
26 and nonmandatory basic and advanced levels of certification for chiefs of
27 police; and

28 (16) In consultation with the Arkansas Sheriffs Association, develop
29 and implement suggested training requirements and nonmandatory basic and
30 advanced levels of certification for sheriffs.

32 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 12-9-106(a), concerning the Arkansas
33 Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, is amended to read as
34 follows:

35 (a)(1) The Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and
36 Training shall provide, by ~~regulation~~ rule, that ~~no~~ a person shall not be



1 appointed as a law enforcement officer, except on a temporary or probationary
2 basis not to exceed one (1) year, unless the person has satisfactorily
3 completed a preparatory program of police training at a school approved by
4 the commission.

5 (2)(A) A law enforcement officer who lacks the education and
6 training qualifications or background investigation required by the
7 commission shall not have his or her temporary or probationary employment
8 extended beyond one (1) year, by renewal of appointment or otherwise, unless
9 extraordinary circumstances exist in the majority opinion of the executive
10 body of the commission, ~~whereupon.~~

11 (B) If the executive body of the commission determines
12 under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section that extraordinary circumstances
13 exist, the commission may approve an extension of ~~probation~~ temporary or
14 probationary employment for no more than an eight-month period.
