2	(2) "Publicly post" or "publicly display" means to intentionally	
3	communicate or otherwise make available to the general public.	
4	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person $\frac{may}{m}$	
5	shall not do any of the following:	
6	(1) Publicly post or publicly display in any manner an	
7	individual's social security number or any five (5) or more consecutive	
8	numbers taken from the individual's social security number;	
9	(2)(A) In order to access products or services provided by a	
10	person:	
11	(i) Print an individual's social security number on	
12	any card required for the individual to access the products or services	
13	provided by the person or entity, including without limitation a driver's	
14	license, a fishing license, a health or drug insurance card or other benefit	
15	card, or a student identification card; or	
16	(ii) Require the disclosure of an individual's	
17	social security number.	
18	(B) If no legal basis exists for requiring an individual	
19	to provide the individual's social security number, the individual may refus	
20	to provide the individual's social security number;	
21	(3) Print an individual's social security number:	
22	(A) On a postcard or other mailer not requiring an	
23	envelope; <del>or</del>	
24	(B) In a manner in which the social security number is	
25	visible on an envelope or without the envelope's being opened; $\underline{\text{or}}$	
26	(C) On any check, draft, or warrant used to compensate or	
27	reimburse an employee or a volunteer; or	
28	(4) Require an individual to transmit his or her social security	
29	number over the Internet unless the:	
30	(A) Connection is secure; or	
31	(B) Social security number is encrypted+;	
32	(5)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(5)(B) of this	
33	section, sell, lease, lend, trade, rent, or otherwise intentionally disclose	
34	an individual's social security number to a third party without written	
35	consent to the disclosure from the individual.	
36	(B) Written consent under subdivision (b)(5)(A) is not	

1	required if the third party is acting as the agent or contractor of a person	
2	performing an action permitted by this section;	
3	(6) Refuse to allow an individual to create or use an	
4	independent number for identification purposes;	
5	(7) Discard or dispose of a record or device containing an	
6	individual's social security number unless before discarding or disposing of	
7	the record or device the person:	
8	(A) Shreds the record or device;	
9	(B) Renders the individual's social security number	
10	contained in the record or device unreadable or irretrievable; or	
11	(C) Takes reasonable actions in conformance with industry	
12	standards to ensure that an unauthorized person will not have access to the	
13	individual's social security number;	
14	(8) Fraudulently obtain, record, or access an individual's	
15	social security number; or	
16	(9) Request an individual's social security number without	
17	disclosing:	
18	(A) The intended use of the social security number;	
19	(B) Whether providing the social security number is	
20	voluntary or mandatory and if mandatory, the state or federal law that	
21	requires the social security number to be provided;	
22	(C) That a service or privilege will not be withheld if	
23	providing the social security number is not mandatory and the social security	
24	number is not provided; and	
25	(D) That the individual may use or create and use a number	
26	other than the individual's social security number unless the exclusive use	
27	of a social security number is required by state or federal law.	
28	(c) This section does not prevent the collection, use, or release of a	
29	social security number:	
30	(1) As required by, or explicitly authorized by, or reasonably	
31	necessary for compliance with federal or state law; or	
32	(2) Pursuant to <u>Under</u> state or federal court rules, including	
33	without limitation a lawfully issued subpoena;	
34	(3) If authorized by an individual, as reasonably necessary for	
35	administrative purposes, internal verification, a criminal background check,	
36	the opening of an account, or the provision of a payment, a product, a	

1	service, or a license so long as the use does not require the release of the
2	social security number to persons not designated by an entity to perform
3	associated functions allowed or authorized by law; or
4	(4) By a college, university, or other institution of higher
5	education to:
6	(A) Confirm grades, test scores, and other records of
7	applicants;
8	(B) Update the records of current or former students; or
9	(C) Collect a debt owed to the college, university, or
10	other institution of higher education.
11	(d) This section does not apply to an entity providing an electronic
12	communications service to the public that is used by another person to
13	violate this section unless the entity:
14	(1) Conspires with another person to violate this section; or
15	(2) Intentionally aids and abets another person in the violation
16	of this section.
17	(e) This section shall not be asserted as a means to avoid compliance
18	with an otherwise valid request for records <del>pursuant to</del> <u>under</u> the Freedom of
19	Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq.
20	(f) The Attorney General may:
21	(1) Bring suit against any person for violating the provisions
22	of this section;
23	(2) Collect civil penalties of up to two hundred fifty dollars
24	(\$250) per violation along with attorney's fees and costs incurred in the
25	investigation and prosecution of the matter; and
26	(3) Seek appropriate injunctive relief.
27	(g) In addition to the civil penalties, fees, costs, and injunctive
28	relief available under subsection (f) of this section, a violation of this
29	section is a Class A misdemeanor.
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
