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2	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is a great need to
4	improve technology in underdeveloped areas of the state; that opportunities
5	for funding and providing technology to these areas should be made available
6	as soon as possible; and that this act improves the ability of the state to
7	improve the technology to rural Arkansas and other underdeveloped areas of

9	needs of these areas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
10	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
11	health, and safety shall become effective on:
