- 1 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1601(f) and (g) concerning unexcused 2 absences, meetings, and duties is amended to read as follows:
- 3 (f)(1) The commission shall meet at times and places the chair deems 4 necessary but no fewer than four (4) times per calendar year.
- 5 (2)(A) Commission members shall attend all meetings with no more 6 than one (1) two (2) unexcused absence absences in a period of eighteen (18) 7 months.
- 8 (B) Commission members with more than two (2) unexcused
  9 absences in a period of eighteen (18) months shall be automatically removed
  10 from the commission and the original nominating entity for the position shall
  11 be notified to fill the vacancy.
  - (3) No meetings shall be held outside the State of Arkansas.
- 13 (4) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute 14 a quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
- 15 (5) All actions of the commission shall be by a majority vote of the full membership of the commission.

- 20 (1) Develop a plan for the state designed to enable all public 21 school students to meet the state's student academic achievement standards 22 while working toward the goal of narrowing the achievement gaps in public 23 schools for the following subgroups:
  - (A) Economically disadvantaged students; and
  - (B) Students from major racial and ethnic groups;
- 26 (2) Monitor the Department of Education's efforts to comply with 27 federal guidelines on improving the academic achievement of the 28 disadvantaged, specifically including, but not limited to, the No Child Left 29 Behind Act of 2001;
