28	district has experienced two (2) or more indicators of facilities distress in
29	one (1) school year that the division deems to be nonmaterial, but that
30	without intervention could place the district in facilities distress.
31	(2) The superintendent of a school district shall report to the
32	division if the superintendent is aware the school district has experienced
33	two (2) or more indicators of facilities distress in one (1) school year that
34	the superintendent deems to be nonmaterial, but that without intervention
35	could place the district in facilities distress.
36	(3)(A) The Department of Education and the superintendent shall

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1	review all data related to the nonmaterial indicators of facilities distress.
