1	PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE ARKANSAS
2	CONSTITUTION TO MODERNIZE AMENDMENT 42
3	CONCERNING THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION.
4	
5	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL
6	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL
7	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
8	
9	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
10	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
11	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives
12	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election
13	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of
14	the State of Arkansas, to wit:
15	
16	SECTION 1. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 42, Section 2, regarding
17	the State Highway Commission, is amended to read as follows:
18	§ 2. Qualifications and appointment of members - Terms of office of
19	first commission.
20	(a) Within ten days after the convening of the General Assembly of the
21	State of Arkansas in the year 1953, the Governor, by and with the advice and
22	consent of the Senate, shall appoint five persons who are qualified electors
23	of the State to constitute the State Highway Commission for terms of two,
24	four, six, eight and ten years respectively. The terms of the persons so
25	appointed shall be determined by lot. The Commissioners to be appointed from
26	the State at large; provided, however, that no two Commissioners shall be
27	appointed from any single Congressional District.
28	(b)(1) There shall be one highway commissioner from each congressional
29	district, and the commissioner appointed to the State Highway Commission
30	shall serve the same constituency that the member of Congress for that
31	district serves.
32	(2) All appointments shall comply with state ethics laws.
33	(c)(l) If Arkansas has an even number of congressional districts, then
34	there shall be an additional at-large commissioner who shall serve the state
35	as a whole for a term of five years.
36	(2)(A)(i) An at-large commissioner shall be selected from a

- 1 regional district of the state and the regional districts applicable and
- 2 <u>created under this subsection (c) only applies to the appointment of an at-</u>
- 3 <u>large commissioner when Arkansas has an even number of congressional</u>
- 4 districts.
- 5 <u>(ii) An at-large commissioner shall be appointed</u>
- 6 from each regional district until an at-large commissioner has been appointed
- 7 from every regional district at least one time.
- 8 (iii) The order in which the at-large commissioner
- 9 is appointed from each regional district shall be established by the order of
- 10 the appointments of the first five at-large commissioners.
- 11 (B) If an at-large commissioner cannot serve his or her
- 12 entire term, then the commissioner appointed to replace him or her shall be
- 13 from the same regional district as the commissioner being replaced and shall
- 14 serve the remainder of term of the commissioner being replaced.
- 15 <u>(3) The regional districts for selecting at-large commissioners</u>
- 16 are:
- 17 (A) The Central District, to include the counties of
- 18 Conway, Faulkner, Perry, Pulaski, Lonoke, Prairie, Garland, Saline, Hot
- 19 Spring, Grant, Jefferson, Yell, and White;
- 20 (B) The Northwest Ozark District, to include the counties
- 21 of Benton, Carroll, Boone, Marion, Baxter, Washington, Madison, Newton,
- 22 Searcy, Crawford, Franklin, Johnson, Van Buren, Sebastian, Logan, Fulton, and
- 23 Scott;
- 24 (C) The Southwest Ouachita District, to include Polk,
- 25 Montgomery, Howard, Pike, Sevier, Little River, Hempstead, Nevada, Miller,
- 26 Lafayette, Columbia, Ouachita, Calhoun, Union, Clark, and Dallas;
- 27 (D) The Mississippi Delta District, to include St.
- 28 Francis, Monroe, Lee, Phillips, Arkansas, Lincoln, Desha, Drew, Chicot,
- 29 Ashley, Bradley, Cleveland; and
- 30 (E) The Crowley's Ridge District, to include Randolph,
- 31 Clay, Sharp, Lawrence, Stone, Greene, Craighead, Mississippi, Cleburne,
- 32 Independence, Jackson, Poinsett, Cross, Crittenden, Fulton, Woodruff, and
- 33 Izard.
- 34 (4) An at-large commissioner appointed after January 1, 2011,
- 35 shall have his or her primary residence in the regional district that he or
- 36 she is appointed to represent.

1	(d)(1)(A) Upon the effective date of subsections (b) and (c) of this
2	section, the highway commission districts shall be the same as the
3	congressional districts in effect at that time.
4	(B)(i) The Highway Commission shall determine which of the
5	five commissioners is the at-large commissioner, and that commissioner shall
6	be the first at-large commissioner appointed from a regional district that is
7	his or her primary residence as provided under subsection (c) of this
8	section.
9	(ii) The first at-large commissioner appointed under
10	this subsection (d)(1)(B) shall serve the remainder of his or her term,
11	regardless if it exceeds five years.
12	(2) When congressional districts change because of the most
13	recent federal decennial census, the highway commission districts shall be
14	changed to be the same as the congressional districts at that time.
15	(3) Appointments to the commission made after January 1, 2011,
16	shall comply with the purpose and intent of subsections (b) and (c) of this
17	section.
18	(4) Compliance with subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this
19	section shall be made as soon as practicable.
20	(e) A commissioner appointed after January 1, 2011, is required to
21	have his or her primary residence in the congressional district that he or
22	she is appointed to represent.
23	(f) In the event of rejection by the Senate of a person whose name has
24	been so submitted, the Governor shall within five days after receipt of
25	written notice from the Secretary of the Senate of such rejection submit the
26	name of another appointee to fill such vacancy. In the event the Governor
27	should within five days thereafter fail to appoint or fail to submit to the
28	Senate for confirmation the name of any person to be appointed, the Senate
29	shall proceed to make the appointment of its own choice.
30	
31	SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 42, Section 3, regarding
32	the State Highway Commission, is amended to read as follows:
33	3. Terms of office of members.
34	Upon the expiration of the foregoing terms of said Commissioners, a
35	successor shall be appointed by the Governor in the manner provided for in
36	Section 2 for a term of ten years, which term shall thereafter be for each

1	member of the Commission, except for the term of the at-large commissioner
2	which shall be for five years.
3	
4	SECTION 3. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 42, Section 5, regarding
5	the State Highway Commission, is amended to read as follows:
6	5. Vacancies - Filling.
7	(a) Vacancies on the Commission due to resignations, death or removal
8	shall be filled by appointment of the Governor for the unexpired term within
9	thirty days from the date of such vacancy. Upon failure of the Governor to
10	fill the vacancy within thirty days, the remaining Commissioners shall make
11	the appointment for the unexpired term.
12	(b) If a commissioner appointed to a ten-year term cannot serve his or
13	her entire term, then the commissioner appointed to replace him or her shall
14	be from the same congressional district as the commissioner being replaced
15	and shall serve the remainder of the term of the commissioner being replaced.
16	
17	SECTION 4. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 42, regarding the State
18	Highway Commission, is amended to add additional sections to read as follows:
19	§ 7. Use of discretionary funding.
20	(a) As used in this section, "discretionary funding" means moneys
21	available for use by the State Highway Commission or the Arkansas State
22	Highway and Transportation Department that are not:
23	(1) Designated for a specific use under law;
24	(2) Required to be used by law or by contract for debt service;
25	<u>or</u>
26	(3) Required to be used by law or by contract as a source for
27	matching funds.
28	(b) Beginning on January 1, 2012, discretionary funding shall be
29	divided equally over a ten-year period for each congressional district.
30	(c) The State Highway Commission shall account for the expenditure of
31	discretionary funding in each congressional district on an annual basis to
32	the General Assembly as provided by law.

35	If the most recent decennial census results in the state adding or
36	losing a congressional district and the newly drawn districts have two or
