9	RECOGNIZING JANUARY AS CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS

13	RECOGNIZING JANUARY AS CERVICAL CANCER
14	AWARENESS MONTH.

17	WHEREAS, even though it is an easily preventable disease with regular
18	screening and is easily curable when caught early, there are still eleven
19	thousand seventy (11,070) newly detected cases of cervical cancer estimated
20	to be diagnosed in the United States in 2008; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimated one hundred thirty (130)
23	new cases of cervical cancer would be diagnosed in Arkansas in 2008; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, after the District of Columbia, Arkansas ranked second in the
26	nation for cervical cancer mortality from 2001 to 2005; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, in Arkansas, the cervical cancer mortality rate for black
29	women is twice as high as the cervical cancer mortality rate for white women,
30	and the cervical cancer mortality rate for Arkansas Hispanic women is almost
31	three times the mortality rate for Hispanic women in the United States; and
32	LHEDEAS in Autonoog in 2005 those rows one hundred thinty nine (120)
33 34	WHEREAS, in Arkansas in 2005, there were one hundred thirty-nine (139)
35	newly diagnosed invasive cervical cancer cases and fifty-two (52) cervical cancer deaths; and

1	WHEREAS, in 2005, the Arkansas General Assembly passed the Cervical
2	Cancer Care Act that created a task force that contributed significantly to
3	educating the women of Arkansas on the importance of early detection; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, prevention and early detection saves lives, and the best
6	prevention methods include early vaccination, a regular Pap test, and a human
7	papillomavirus (HPV) test when recommended; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, increased awareness of cervical cancer could result in earlier
10	diagnoses and higher survival rates,
11	
12	NOW THEREFORE,
13	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL
14	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
15	
16	That the House of Representatives recognizes the prevalence of cervical
17	cancer, encourages Arkansans to participate in prevention and early detection
18	opportunities, and recognizes January as Cervical Cancer Awareness Month.
19	
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate
21	copy shall be provided to the Arkansas Chapter of the American Cancer Society
22	by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.
