2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the country is in a recession,			
4	that the retirement systems have suffered from the failing economy, that			
5	increasing the time period that a member must be terminated from employment			
6	before receiving retirement benefits will benefit the Arkansas Public			
7	Employees' Retirement System, and that it is considered sound public policy			
8	to increase the time period that a member must be terminated from employment			
9	before receiving retirement benefits under the Arkansas Public Employees'			
10	Retirement System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act			
11	being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety			
12	shall become effective on July 1, 2009.
