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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-502	(a), concerning the amount of time
28	a member of the Arkansas Teacher Retiremen	t System is required to be
29	terminated from employment before becoming eligible for retirement benefits,	
30	is amended to read as follows:	
31	(a)(l) A member of the Arkansas Tea	cher Retirement System <del>must</del> <u>shall</u>
32	terminate covered employment to be eligibl	e for retirement.
33	(2) Effective July 1, 2009, A $\underline{a}$ member shall not be terminated	
34	from employment for <del>retirement</del> purposes of	retirement eligibility if within
35	thirty (30) one hundred eighty (180) days of the person's member's effective	
36	date of retirement the person member returns to a position that would	

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1	otherwise be covered by the system:	
2	(A) Becomes employed with an employer covered by the	
3	system; and	
4	(B) Does not meet the system's retirement age requirement.	
5	(3) A person failing member who fails to meet the termination	
6	requirement of this subsection shall forfeit the person's all retirement	
7	benefits until the <u>termination</u> requirement is met.	
8	(4)(A) A member shall repay to the system any retirement	
9	benefits that are paid to the member by the system during the waiting period	
10	of one hundred eighty (180) in subdivision (a)(2) of this section.	
11	(B) The system may require the repayment of retirement	
12	benefits from the member indirectly under the system's standard withholding	
13	rule.	
14	(5) For a member who fails to meet the termination requirement	
15	in subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section, the member shall immediately	
16	become an active member of the system upon reemployment by a covered

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19	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-7-701(a), concerning voluntary	
20	retirement, is amended to read as follows:	
21	(a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, and	
22	active member who either attains $\frac{\text{age}}{\text{age}}$ sixty (60) $\frac{\text{years of age}}{\text{age}}$ and has five (5)	
23	or more years of actual and reciprocal service or who has twenty-eight (28)	
24	or more years of credited service regardless of age may voluntarily retire	
25	upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas	
26	Teacher Retirement System.	
27	(2)(A) A member shall-terminate covered employment meet the	
28	termination of covered employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be	
29	eligible for retirement except if the member has attained normal retirement	
30	age.	
31	(B) A member shall not be terminated from employment for	
32	retirement purposes if the person returns to a position that would otherwise	
33	be covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days

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           SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-7-702(a), concerning early voluntary
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     retirement, is amended to read as follows:
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           (a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, an
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     active or inactive member who has twenty-five (25) or more years of credited
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     service but has not attained age sixty (60) years of age and is not eligible
     for retirement under the provisions of § 24-7-701 may voluntarily retire
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     early upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the
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     Arkansas Teacher Retirement System.
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                 (2)(A) A member shall-terminate meet the termination of covered
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     employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be eligible for retirement except
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     if the member has attained normal retirement age.
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                       (B) A member shall not be terminated from employment for
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     retirement purposes if the person returns to a position that would otherwise
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     be covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days
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     of the person's effective date of retirement.
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                       (C) A person failing A member who fails to meet the
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     termination of covered employment requirements of this under subsection (a)
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     of this section shall forfeit retirement benefits until the requirements are

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           SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(a)(1)(B), concerning a disability
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     retirement, is amended to read as follows:
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                       (B)(i) An active member who has met the eligibility
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     requirement of subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section shall terminate meet the
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     termination of covered employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be
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     eligible for disability retirement benefits.
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                             (ii) If a member returns to work in a position
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     covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days of
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     the person's effective date of disability retirement, then the member shall
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     not be considered terminated from employment for retirement purposes and
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     shall forfeit disability retirement benefits until the termination
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     requirements are met.
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SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(c)(5), concerning a disability

1 retirant returning to full-time service, is amended to read as follows: 2 (5)(A) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service as 3 defined by rules determined by the board prior to attaining sixty (60) years 4 of age, his or her disability retirement shall terminate. 5 (B) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service 6 as defined by rules promulgated by the board after attaining sixty (60) years 7 of age, the retirant shall be treated as if he or she retired under § 24-7-8 701 and is subject to the limitations applicable to age and service 9 retirants. 10 11 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 24-7-708 is amended to read as follows: 12 24-7-708. Conditions subjecting annuities to limitations Employment of 13 retired members by covered employers. 14 (a) Except as provided in subsections (f) and (g) of this section, if 15 a retirant is an employee of a public employer whose employees are covered by 16 the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, then, for each twelve month period 17 ending June 30, the amount of his or her system annuity shall be subject to the limitations equivalent to twice the limitations imposed by the social 18 security retirement test Effective July 1, 2009, after terminating employment 19 20 under § 24-7-502 or reaching the age of normal retirement, a retirant may: 21 (1) Accept employment with an employer covered by the system 22 without a limitation of his or her retirement annuity; and 23 (2) Continue to receive his or her monthly retirement annuity. 24 For each year ending June 30, the social security retirement test 25 to be considered shall be the test in effect for the calendar year beginning 26 the January 1 immediately preceding June 30. The retirant's earnings shall be 27 his or her remuneration for the employment for the year ending June 30 28 Employers covered by the system that hire an employee who meets the 29 conditions under subsection (a) of this section shall report the hiring of 30 the retirant to the system in a time and a manner that the system may 31 reasonably require. 32 The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System 33 shall establish equivalent limitations by appropriate rules and regulations. 34 (d) Receiving remuneration as an employee from any private employer or 35 as a member of the General Assembly shall not affect payment of an annuity. 36 (e) During any period of employment in a position covered by the

- 1 system, a A retirant that receives monthly benefits and is employed by a 2 covered employer shall not accrue additional credited service credit. 3 (f)(1) In accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the State 4 Board of Education, the Department of Education may request of the board of 5 trustees or its designee a waiver of the conditions subjecting annuities to 6 limitations. If approved by the board of trustees or its designee, the waiver 7 shall be effective for a one-year period, with the option to renew annually for up to a total of six (6) years as requested by the department. 8 9 (2) A waiver of the conditions subjecting annuities to 10 limitations may be requested if the retirant is hired by a public school 11 district due to a shortage of certified teachers in a critical academic area 12 in which the retirant is certified. 13 (3) The critical academic areas in which there is a shortage of 14 certified teachers shall be determined annually by the State Board of 15 Education. 16 (4) School districts shall maintain audit files identifying 17 personnel granted a waiver and documenting the reasons for the waiver. 18 (5) Beginning July 1, 2005, for any retired member employed in a 19 position covered by the system pursuant to a waiver, an amount equal to the 20 combined employer and employee contribution rate or rates to the system on 21 behalf of the member shall recommence at the rate in effect at the time of 22 the employment and shall be remitted by the employer. 2.3 (d)(1) For a retired member employed in a position covered by the 24 system, the covered employer shall remit the contributions on all salary paid to the retirant in an amount equal to the employer contribution rate in 25 26 effect for the period of employment. (2) Contributions shall be paid by the employer and are not the 27 2.8 responsibility of the retirant. 29 (e)(1) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System 30 shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this section.

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           SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 24-7-1303(a)(3)(A), concerning the
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     contributions to the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan, is amended to
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     read as follows:
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                       (a)(3)(A)(i) Beginning September 1, 2003, for members
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     whose effective date in the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan is before
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     September 1, 2003, the employer contribution rate to the system on behalf of
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     all members in the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan shall recommence
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     at the rate of:
                             (i)(a) One percent (1%) for the period from July 1,
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     2003, through June 30, 2005;
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                             (ii)(b) Three percent (3%) for the period from July
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     1, 2005, through June 30, 2007;
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                             (iii)(c) Six percent (6%) for the period from July
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     1, 2007, through June 30, 2009;
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                             (iv)(ii) Nine percent (9%) for the period from July
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     1, 2009, through June 30, 2011;
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                             (v) Twelve percent (12%) for the period from July 1,
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     2011, through June 30, 2013; and
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                             (vi) After July 1, 2013, the percentage rate
     established by the entity having the authority to set the employer
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     contribution rate for the system pursuant to § 24-7-401. After July 1, 2009,
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     the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall set the
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     employer contribution rate for the system's covered employers pursuant to §
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     24-7-401.
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           SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
     General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the
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     Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Act are badly in need of revision and
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     updating to bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy;
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     that such revision and updating is of great importance to members of the
     Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of
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     Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to maintain an
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1	orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement
2	System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
3	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
4	become effective on July 1,2009.
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
