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27	SECTION 1. Ark	ansas Code § 24-7-502(a), concernin	ng the amount of time
28	a member of the Arkan	sas Teacher Retirement System is re	equired to be
29	terminated from employment before becoming eligible for retirement benefits,

31	(a)(1) A member	r of the Arkansas Teacher Retiremen	nt System must <u>shall</u>

33	(2) Except for a member who accumulates eight (8) or more years

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1 (30) one hundred eighty (180) days of the person's member's effective date of 2 retirement the person member returns to a position that would otherwise be 3 covered by the system: 4 (A) Becomes employed with an employer covered by the 5 system; and 6 (B) Has not attained the system's normal retirement age. 7 (3) A person failing member who fails to meet the termination 8 requirement of this subsection shall forfeit the person's all retirement 9 benefits until the termination requirement is met. 10 (4)(A) A member shall repay to the system any retirement 11 benefits that are paid to the member by the system during the waiting period of one hundred eighty (180) in subdivision (a)(2) of this section. 12 13 (B) The system may require the repayment of retirement benefits from the member indirectly under the system's standard withholding 14 15 rule. 16 (5) For a member who fails to meet the termination requirement 17 in subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section, the member shall immediately become an active member of the system upon reemployment by a covered 18 19 employer. 20 21 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-7-701(a), concerning voluntary 22 retirement, is amended to read as follows: 23 (a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, an 24 active member who either attains age sixty (60) years of age and has five (5) 25 or more years of actual and reciprocal service or who has twenty-eight (28) 26 or more years of credited service regardless of age may voluntarily retire 27 upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas 28 Teacher Retirement System. (2)(A) A member shall terminate covered employment meet the 29 30 termination of covered employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be 31 eligible for retirement except if the member has attained normal retirement 32 age. 33 (B) A member shall not be terminated from employment for 34 retirement purposes if the person returns to a position that would otherwise 35 be covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days 36 of the person's effective date of retirement.

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5	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-7-702(a), concerning early voluntary		
6	retirement, is amended to read as follows:		
7	(a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, ar		
8	active or inactive member who has twenty-five (25) or more years of credited		
9	service but has not attained age sixty (60) years of age and is not eligible		
10	for retirement under the provisions of § 24-7-701 may voluntarily retire		
11	early upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the		
12	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System.		
13	(2)(A) A member shall—terminate meet the termination of covered		
14	employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be eligible for retirement except		
15	if the member has attained normal retirement age.		
16	(B) A member shall not be terminated from employment for		
17	retirement purposes if the person returns to a position that would otherwise		
18	be covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days		
19	of the person's effective date of retirement.		
20	(C) A person failing A member who fails to meet the		
21	termination of <u>covered</u> employment requirements of this <u>under</u> subsection <u>(a)</u>		
22	of this section shall forfeit retirement benefits until the requirements are

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25	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(a)(1)(B), concerning a disability		
26	retirement, is amended to read as follows:		
27	(B) (i) An active member who has met the eligibility		
28	requirement of subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section shall terminate meet the		
29	termination of covered employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be		
30	eligible for disability retirement benefits.		
31	(ii) If a member returns to work in a position		
32	covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days of		
33	the person's effective date of disability retirement, then the member shall		
34	not be considered terminated from employment for retirement purposes and		
35	shall forfeit disability retirement benefits until the termination		
36	requirements are met.		

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2	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(c)(5), concerning a disability		
3	retirant returning to full-time service, is amended to read as follows:		
4	(5)(A) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service as		
5	defined by rules determined by the board prior to attaining sixty (60) years		
6	of age, his or her disability retirement shall terminate.		
7	(B) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service		
8	as defined by rules promulgated by the board after attaining sixty (60) years		
9	of age, the retirant shall be treated as if he or she retired under § 24-7-		
10	701—and is subject to the limitations applicable to age and service		
11	retirants.		
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13	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 24-7-708 is amended to read as follows:		
14	24-7-708. Conditions subjecting annuities to limitations Employment of		
15	retired members by covered employers.		
16	(a) Except as provided in subsections (f) and (g) of this section, if		
17	a retirant is an employee of a public employer whose employees are covered by		
18	the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, then, for each twelve-month period		
19	ending June 30, the amount of his or her system annuity shall be subject to		
20	the limitations equivalent to twice the limitations imposed by the social		
21	security retirement test Effective July 1, 2009, after terminating employment		
22	under § 24-7-502 or reaching the age of normal retirement, a retirant may:		
23	(1) Accept employment with an employer covered by the system		
24	without a limitation of his or her retirement annuity; and		
25	(2) Continue to receive his or her monthly retirement annuity.		
26	(b) For each year ending June 30, the social security retirement test		
27	to be considered shall be the test in effect for the calendar year beginning		
28	the January 1 immediately preceding June 30. The retirant's earnings shall be		
29	his or her remuneration for the employment for the year ending June 30		
30	Employers covered by the system that hire an employee who meets the		
31	conditions under subsection (a) of this section shall report the hiring of		
32	the retirant to the system in a time and a manner that the system may		
33	reasonably require.		
34	(c) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System		
35	shall establish equivalent limitations by appropriate rules and regulations.		

(d) Receiving remuneration as an employee from any private employer or

- 1 as a member of the General Assembly shall not affect payment of an annuity. 2 (e) During any period of employment in a position covered by the 3 system, a A retirant that receives monthly benefits and is employed by a 4 covered employer shall not accrue additional-credited service credit. 5 (f)(1) In accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the State 6 Board of Education, the Department of Education may request of the board of 7 trustees or its designee a waiver of the conditions subjecting annuities to 8 limitations. (e)(1) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System
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- shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this section. 32
- 33 (2) A covered employer that employs retirants is subject to the rules adopted by the board. 34
- 35 (g) (1) A retired member entering into a position of employment with the
- Department of Education is exempt from this section and shall be employed 36

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     with no limitations placed on his or her earnings.
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                 (2) For any retired member returning to work under subdivision
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     (g)(1) of this section, the employer and employee contribution rate to the
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     system on behalf of the member shall recommence at the rate in effect at the

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           SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 24-7-1303(a)(3)(A), concerning the
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     contributions to the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan, is amended to
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     read as follows:
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                       (a)(3)(A)(i) Beginning September 1, 2003, for members
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     whose effective date in the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan is before
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     September 1, 2003, the employer contribution rate to the system on behalf of
     all members in the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan shall recommence
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     at the rate of:
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                             (i)(a) One percent (1%) for the period from July 1,
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     2003, through June 30, 2005;
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                             (ii)(b) Three percent (3%) for the period from July
     1, 2005, through June 30, 2007;
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                             (iii)(c) Six percent (6%) for the period from July
     1, 2007, through June 30, 2009;
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                             (iv)(ii) Nine percent (9%) for the period from July
     1, 2009, through June 30, 2011;
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                             (v) Twelve percent (12%) for the period from July 1,
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     2011, through June 30, 2013; and
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                             (vi) After July 1, 2013, the percentage rate
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     established by the entity having the authority to set the employer
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     contribution rate for the system pursuant to § 24-7-401. After July 1, 2009,
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     the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall set the
     employer contribution rate for the system's covered employers pursuant to §
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     24-7-401.
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           SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
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     General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the
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     Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Act are badly in need of revision and
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     updating to bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy;
     that such revision and updating is of great importance to members of the
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1	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of		
2	Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to maintain an		
3	orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement		
4	System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being		
5	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
6	become effective on July 1,2009.
