20	TO ADJUST THE AMOUNT OF TIME A RETIRED

23	BEFORE RETURNING TO COVERED EMPLOYMENT.
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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-502(a), concerning the amount of time
29	a member of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System is required to be
30	terminated from employment before returning to work with a covered employer,
31	is amended to read as follows:
32	(a)(1) A member of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System <u>must shall</u>
33	terminate covered employment to be eligible for retirement.
34	(2)(A) A Effective July 2, 2009, a member shall not be
35	terminated from employment for retirement purposes of retirement eligibility
36	if within thirty (30) one hundred eighty (180) days of the person's member's

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1	effective date of retirement the person member returns to a position that
2	would otherwise be covered by the system:
3	(i) Meets both of the following requirements:
4	(a) Becomes employed with an employer covered
5	by the system; and
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7	(b) Has not attained the system's normal
8	retirement age; or
9	(ii) Does not have total or a combined total of
10	thirty-eight (38) years or more of credited service in the system, T-DROP, or
11	reciprocal service in another eligible state retirement system.
12	(B) If a member has a combined total of thirty-eight (38)
13	years or more of credited service in the system, T-DROP, or reciprocal
14	credited service in another eligible state retirement system, then the member
15	shall not be terminated from employment for purposes of retirement
16	eligibility if within thirty (30) days of the member's effective date of
17	retirement the member:
18	(i) Becomes employed with an employer covered by the

22	(3) A <del>person failing</del> <u>member who fails</u> to meet the termination
23	requirement of this subsection shall forfeit the person's all retirement

25	(4)(A) A member shall repay to the system any retirement
26	benefits that are paid to the member by the system during the waiting period

28	(B) The system may require the repayment of retirement

31	(5) For a member who fails to meet the termination requirement

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36	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-7-701(a), concerning voluntary

- 1 retirement, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, an
- 3 active member who either attains age sixty (60) years of age and has five (5)
- 4 or more years of actual and reciprocal service or who has twenty-eight (28)
- 5 or more years of credited service regardless of age may voluntarily retire
- 6 upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas
- 7 Teacher Retirement System.
- 8 (2)(A) A member shall-terminate covered employment meet the

- 24 service but has not attained age sixty (60) years of age and is not eligible

Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(a)(1)(B), concerning a disability 5 retirement, is amended to read as follows: 6 (B)(i) An active member who has met the eligibility 7 requirement of subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section shall terminate meet the 8 termination of covered employment requirements under § 24-7-502 to be 9 eligible for disability retirement benefits. 10 (ii) If a member returns to work in a position 11 covered by the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System within thirty (30) days of 12 the person's effective date of disability retirement, then the member shall 13 not be considered terminated from employment for retirement purposes and 14 shall forfeit disability retirement benefits until the termination 15 requirements are met. 16 17 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-7-704(c)(5), concerning a disability retirant returning to full-time service, is amended to read as follows: 18 (5)(A) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service as 19 20 defined by rules determined by the board prior to attaining sixty (60) years 21 of age, his or her disability retirement shall terminate. 22 (B) If a disability retirant returns to full-time service 23 as defined by rules promulgated by the board after attaining sixty (60) years 24 of age, the retirant shall be treated as if he or she retired under § 24-7-25 701 and is subject to the limitations applicable to age and service 26 retirants. 27 28 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 24-7-708 is amended to read as follows: 29 24-7-708. Conditions subjecting annuities to limitations Employment of 30 retired members by covered employers. 31 (a) Except as provided in subsections (f) and (g) of this section, if 32 a retirant is an employee of a public employer whose employees are covered by 33 the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, then, for each twelve month period ending June 30, the amount of his or her system annuity shall be subject to 34 35 the limitations equivalent to twice the limitations imposed by the social security retirement test Effective July 1, 2009, after terminating employment 36

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11	SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
12	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the
13	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Act are badly in need of revision and
14	updating to bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy;
15	that such revision and updating is of great importance to members of the
16	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of
17	Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to maintain an
18	orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement
19	System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
20	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
21	become effective on July 1,2009.
