Moneys added to fund - Contributions. 23 (a) There shall be added to the policemen's pension and relief fund 24 the following moneys: 25 (1) All forfeitures and fines imposed upon any member of the 26 police department by way of discipline; 27 (2) All money given or donated to the fund; 28 (3) All money deducted from the salary of any member of the 29 police department on account of absence or loss of time; 30 (4) All rewards paid for any purpose; 31 (5) Ten percent (10%) of all fines and forfeitures, not 32 including court costs, collected by the county or city official, agency, or 33 department designated pursuant to § 16-13-709 as primarily responsible for the collection of fines assessed in the district courts of this state for 34 35 violation of ordinances or state law that pursuant to law would be deposited

Arkansas Code § 24-11-415, concerning proceeds derived from the sale of confiscated goods, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows: (c) A pension and relief fund that has assigned administrative responsibility for the fund to the Arkansas Local Police and Fire Retirement System under § 24-11-406, continues to be eligible to collect and deposit these amounts as contributions until the unfunded liability as a result of the consolidation has been fully amortized.

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
