SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-1-104(a), concerning certain felony offenses, is amended to read as follows:

- 8 (a) The following offenses shall be deemed felonies punishable as 9 provided in this section:
- (1) No person shall falsely make or fraudulently destroy any
 certificate of nominations or any part thereof, file any certificate of
 nominations knowing the certificate or any part thereof to be false, suppress
 any nomination or any part thereof which has been filed, or forge or falsely
 write the name or initials of any election official on any ballot;
- 15 (2) No public official or other person shall in any manner 16 willfully or corruptly permit any person not entitled to register for the 17 purpose of voting to register, nor shall a public official or other person 18 forge or attempt to forge a registration;
- 19 (3) No person shall vote in any election in the state unless the 20 person is a qualified elector of this state and has registered to vote in the 21 manner provided by law;
- 22 (4) It shall be unlawful for any person to offer, accept, 23 receive, or pay any person any money, goods, wares, or merchandise or solicit 24 any money, goods, wares, or merchandise for the purpose of influencing his or 25 her vote during the progress of any election in this state;
 - (5) It shall be unlawful for any person to make any threat or attempt to intimidate any elector or the family, business, or profession of the elector;
