31	(2) Authorize an individual to whom a medical practice is		
32	delegated to delegate the performance of that practice to another individual;		
33	(3) Authorize a podiatrist to delegate the administration of		
34	anesthesia; or		
35	(4) Conflict with a provision of the Arkansas Code that		
36	specifically authorizes an individual to perform a particular practice.
