AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE § 16-17-1105(a) TO
ADD ALPENA AND SALESVILLE TO THE LIST OF CITY
COURTS TO BE CONSOLIDATED WITH DISTRICT COURTS;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

TO ADD ALPENA AND SALESVILLE TO THE LIST
OF CITY COURTS TO BE CONSOLIDATED WITH
DISTRICT COURTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 16-17-1105(a), concerning consolidation of
city courts with district courts, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The city courts located in the following cities or towns shall be
consolidated with district courts:

- (1) Alexander;
- (2) Alpena;

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Alpena and Salesville were
 inadvertently left out of Act 663 of 2007; and that this act is immediately
 necessary to further the goal of unified court system to provide judicial
 economy and fair administration of justice. Therefore, an emergency is
 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
 on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
