EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 27 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that since September 11, 2001, the 28 country has an increased need for soldiers to fight against terrorism, 29 domestic and abroad; that National Guard members risk their lives to protect 30 and defend our country; that there is a constant need for recruits; and this 31 act will immediately impact recruiting efforts by offering a tuition incentive that is comparable to other states. Therefore, an emergency is 32 33 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the 34 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective 35 on: 36 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

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1	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
2	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the

4	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
5	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
