

For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 7 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a 8 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 9 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 10 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 11 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 12 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 13 14 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 15 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 16 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 17 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 18 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 19 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The 20 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 21 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 22 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 23 as is deemed necessary.

AUTHORITY. The Director of the Department of Education, with the approval of

2 Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary. 3 4 Provided, however, that the Department of Education shall be limited to 5 submitting no more than two transfer requests during any fiscal year. 6 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 7 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 8 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 9 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 10 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 11 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 12 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 13 if some flexibility is provided to the Director of the Department of 14 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 15 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 16 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 17 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 18 19 is not a severable part of this section. The Department of Education 3 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 4 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 5 6 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for 7 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 8 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, and 9 five ten thousand dollars (\$5,000) (\$10,000) each fiscal year for the State 10 History Day Competition. The Department of Education shall allocate General 11 Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred thirty two seven thousand 12 dollars (\$132,000) (\$137,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the 13 Quiz Bowl, the Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for 14 15 students and chaperones, Destination Imagination, and the State History Day 16 Competition. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 17 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas, 18 Inc., Destination Imagination, and the State History Day Competition as 19 authorized herein in order to fulfill the provisions of this section. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007 20 21 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST 25 FUNDING PROVISION. The Department 12 shall either expend or have committed for expenditure the monies allocated 13 for the Explor-Net Program Center for Quality Teaching and Learning in order 14 to fulfill the provisions of this section.

SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 19 20 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item 21 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for 22 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school 23 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, 24 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by 25 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 26 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 27 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 28 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 29 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be 30 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 31 school district participating in the program.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2007}{33}$ 33 $\frac{2009}{2010}$ through June 30, $\frac{2009}{2010}$.

34

35 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. Of the total amount appropriated for Professional Development Funding for each fiscal year of the 2007-2009 biennium, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) may be authorized by the Director of the Department of Education to be used by the Department of Education to develop and implement statewide professional development support systems for teachers that will benefit student achievement.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
8 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

9

10 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 12 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any 13 14 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the 15 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for 16 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the 17 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas, Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the 18 19 Department of Correction.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
21 <u>2009</u> through June 30, 2009 <u>2010</u>.

22

23 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN 25 ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS.

26 (a) Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, beginning with the 27 2007-2008-2009-2010 school year, no school district shall receive state 28 funding for those students in the district's prior year three quarter average 29 daily membership who were enrolled and attending a public school with an 30 internet, long-distance or virtual technology curriculum based program which was not part of a public school district and the public school program was 31 32 funded by a federal voluntary public school choice grant administered by the 33 Department of Education.

(b) Prior to July 1, 2007 2009, the Department of Education shall notify
the Arkansas State Board of Education of the maximum number of students that
the State Board of Education shall allow to enroll and attend any open-

1 enrollment charter school that uses internet, long-distance or virtual 2 technology as the primary method of teaching. It is the intent of this language that the Department shall not establish and certify a number of 3 4 students to the State Board of Education that exceeds the number of students 5 for which school districts were not able to receive state funding because of 6 the requirements of paragraph (a). However, to the extent there are any 7 revenue savings caused by the closure of any open-enrollment charter school 8 in existence on July 1, 2006 2008, the State Board of Education may increase 9 the maximum number of students allowed to enroll and attend an internet, 10 long-distance or virtual technology open-enrollment charter school to the 11 extent the maximum number of students does not exceed five hundred (500) 12 students.

13 (c) The provisions of this special language shall not restrict, affect or
14 impair any other provision of law or rule concerning public school districts
15 or public charter schools except as provided in paragraph (a) and (b).
16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
17 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

18

SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER 20 21 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby 22 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for 23 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds 24 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to 25 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of 26 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek 27 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 28 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds 29 30 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program. 31

32 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 33 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 34 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 35 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 36 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by

1 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary 2 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as 3 4 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative 5 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. 6 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 7 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, 8 this entire section is void.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
10 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

11

12 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AVERAGE 14 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to 15 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical 16 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is 17 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers. 18 19 The Arkansas Department of Education shall report on the feasibility of this 20 action to the House and Senate Committees on Education by February 1, 2007 21 2009.

22

23 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY 25 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better 26 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, 2008 2010 and June 27 30, 2009, in the Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be 28 designated and retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success 29 Program.

30 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of <u>appropriation and/or</u> funding as 31 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2008 2010 and June 30, 2009 the Agency shall by
written statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said
appropriation and/or funding to the Department of Finance and Administration
Office of Budget;

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall

1 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward-from 2 the first fiscal year of the biennium to the second fiscal year of the biennium by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 3 4 Committee meeting in the second fiscal year of the biennial period and from 5 the second year of the biennium by the following September Arkansas 6 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall 7 include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the 8 amount of the appropriation and/or funding carried forward from the first 9 fiscal year to the second fiscal year, the program name or line item, the 10 funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request set 11 forth in (1) above;

12 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 13 14 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written 15 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for 16 which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30) 17 days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget 18 19 Committee; and

Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include 20 (4) 21 all information obtained in item (3) above in the biennial budget manuals 22 and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or 23 Institution.

24

25 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PUBLIC SCHOOL RETIREE HEALTH INSURANCE. The Employee Benefits Division of the 27 28 Department of Finance and Administration may use up to eleven dollars and twenty cents (\$11.20) from each contribution made under Arkansas Code §6-17-29 30 1117 (a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible members electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance 31 32 program as a retiree. 33

SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 34 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS/STRIVE PROGRAM TRANSFER. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 36

1 shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the State 2 Auditor, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) during each 3 fiscal year of the biennium from the Department of Education Public School 4 Fund Account to the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, specifically 5 to provide funding for the Arkansas/STRIVE Program. The total amount of funds 6 transferred each fiscal year pursuant to this section shall not be subject to 7 any indirect costs by the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007 9 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010. 10 11 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HEALTH 12 13 INSURANCE. The Special Language regarding "Health Insurance" as authorized in SECTION 23 of Act 229 of 2007 is amended to read as follows: 14 15 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE 16 ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 17 HEALTH INSURANCE. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 18 Districts shall pay no less than the health insurance contribution rate 19 established by Arkansas Code 6-17-1117 for each eligible employee electing to 20 participate in the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program. The 21 appropriation contained herein for Public School Employee Insurance each 22 fiscal year shall be used to provide the state contribution for insurance 23 premiums for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas, 24 Vocational Centers, and the school operated by the Department of Correction 25 who participate in the Arkansas Public School Life and Health Insurance 26 Program. 27 In addition, the Department of Education shall pay the Employee Benefits 28 Division of the Department of Finance and Administration a minimum of sixty-

29 one dollars (\$61) per month for each eligible employee electing to

30 participate in the public school employee health insurance program.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
32 <u>2009</u> through June 30, 2009 <u>2010</u>.

33

34 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 36 ALTERNATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. The Department of Education may provide

1 funding for Alternative Learning Environment Programs in excess of the 2 regulatory limitation of six (6) hours per day for those programs that 3 operate more than twelve hours per day, in a proportionate manner and upon 4 special request to the Department of Education.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
6 2009 through June 30, 2009 2010.

7

8 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 9 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 10 11 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 13 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 14 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 16 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

17

SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 18 19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 25 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26

27 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 28 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 29 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 31 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 32 33 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2009 could work irreparable harm upon the 34 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 35 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 36 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and

1	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2009.
